PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE THIRD
SESSION OF THE FIFTH PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas it is expedient to prorogue the said Council and Assembly called the Parliament of Victoria, and to fix a time for holding the next Session thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Council and Assembly or Parliament of Victoria from Friday, the twenty-first day of December instant, until Thursday, the seventeenth day of January, in the ensuing year; and I do hereby fix Thursday, the seventeenth day of January aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session thereof for the despatch of business, at Two of the clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring street, in the City of Melbourne; and the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

CUTTING OR REMOVING LIVE TIMBER IN OR FROM A PORTION OF THE SALE BOROUGH COMMON PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live timber from the Crown lands forming a portion of the Sale Borough Common comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the junction of Flooding Creek with the Latrobe River; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the south-eastern angle of the township of Sale; thence by the east boundary of that township bearing north to the north-west angle of portion 20 in the parish of Sale; thence by the south side of Raglan street bearing west to Flooding Creek aforesaid; thence by a line bearing west 156 chains, more or less, to a point bearing south from the south-west angle of portion 101 in the aforesaid parish; thence by a line bearing south 25 chains, more or less, to the Thomson River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to its junction with the Latrobe River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.16146.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or proclaim (as the case may be), the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

COOLEBARGHURK FARMERS' COMMON.—The Coolebarghurk Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 12th day of August, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 2000 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the point of intersection of the north boundary of the existing common by the right bank of the Moorabool River; thence by the said boundary of the existing common, bearing west two miles and a quarter, more or less, to the Coolebarghurk Creek; thence by that creek bearing westerly to the south angle of allotment 41 in the parish of Meredith; thence by the south-east boundary of that allotment bearing N. 45° E. fifty-one chains eighty links to the east angle thereof; thence by the north-east boundaries of allotments 41 and 40 bearing N. 45° W. twenty chains to the north angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line crossing a road bearing north-westerly to the south angle of allotment 43; thence by the east boundaries of allotments 43 and 42, by a line crossing a road, and by the east boundary of allotment 32, bearing north sixty-seven chains twenty-eight links to the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line bearing east two miles, more or less, to the Moorabool River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing southerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.M.12442.)

DAYLESFORD GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Daylesford Gold-field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 3400 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the eastern extremity of the southernmost boundary of the existing common, the said extremity being a point on the west boundary of the Daylesford Town Common, bearing west from the south-west angle of the township of Daylesford; thence by the said boundary of the last-named common, bearing south one hundred and fifty-one chains, more or less, to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing westerly four miles, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 44 of section B, in the parish of Bullarook; thence northerly, by the eastern boundaries of allotments 44, 96, 95, 94, 93, and 92A, to the east angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line bearing easterly to the south-west angle of the existing gold-field common of Daylesford; and thence by the south boundary of that common bearing east to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(65.K.8790.)

REDRUTH TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands in the township reserve of Redruth, together with allotments 1 and 2 of section 12 in the parish of Bochara, and the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, containing in all an area of 1200 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders in the township of Redruth, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 8, in the parish of Toolka; thence by the southern boundary of that allotment bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line crossing a road bearing west one chain to the east boundary of the Bongmirre pre-emptive section; thence by the east and southern boundaries of that pre-emptive section bearing respectively south and south-westerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by the south-eastern boundary of allotment 5 of section 18, in the parish of Redruth, bearing south-westerly to the south east angle thereof; thence by a branch of the Wannon River bearing south-westerly to its junction with the branch of the same river which forms the northern boundary of allotment 1 of section 1 B, in the parish of Bochara; thence by the last-named branch of the said river bearing easterly to the north-eastern angle of the last-named allotment; thence by the east boundary of that allotment bearing south one chain seven links to the north-west angle of allotment 2; thence by the northern boundaries of sections 1 B and 2 A, bearing north-easterly to the north angle of allotment 1 of the last-named section; and thence by a line (crossing the Wannon River) bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.14403.)

REGULATIONS FOR ADVERTISING IN THE PUBLIC JOURNALS.

THE Government have determined that from and after the 1st of January, 1867, the duties connected with advertising in the public journals shall be performed by an Advertising Officer, and that all orders relating to advertising in the newspapers shall be issued through the Advertising Department of the Government Printing Office.

From and after the above date, therefore, Government advertisements from the different departments in Melbourne, for insertion in the newspapers, are to be forwarded under cover to the Government Printer, accompanied by directions as to the newspapers in which they are to be inserted, and the number of insertions required.

The advertisements and orders, with the word "Advertising" marked on the envelope, should be sent not later than three o'clock on each day.

On receiving such directions, the Government Printer will cause the advertisements to be issued to the newspapers mentioned, and a record of the orders given in each case will be kept for comparison when the accounts are presented for payment.

But as there are certain classes of advertisements that cannot conveniently pass through the Government Printing Office, it will be necessary that the officers residing in the country, who are authorised to issue orders for advertising, should state distinctly on their orders the number of insertions required, and, when practicable, the dates on which the advertisements are to appear in the newspapers.

The accounts, with the orders attached, must be forwarded by the claimants to the officers in country districts incurring the expenditure, who will sign and transmit them to the Government Printing Office, where they are to be examined and certified. They will afterward be sent to the Departments to which they relate, that they may be signed and noted, and thence to the Treasury for payment.

Accounts in which there are no items for advertising ordered by officers in the country should be transmitted direct to the Government Printer, to be dealt with similarly to those above described.

Accounts may be furnished monthly, or, if more convenient, on the completion of any particular order.

The accounts for advertising belonging to each department must be rendered on separate vouchers, but all the items relating to any one department may be put upon the same sheet or sheets, provided more than one sheet be necessary. Accounts for advertising performed in different years must be on different vouchers.

Every account should specify the dates of insertion, the number of inches, the rate per inch, and the total amount in figures and words.

Unless the accounts are in every case accompanied by the orders they cannot be certified.

NOTICE TO NEWSPAPER PROPRIETORS AND PUBLISHERS, AND TO PRINTERS.

BY the *Printers and Newspapers Registration Statute 1864*, it is required that an affidavit, duly sworn and signed by the proprietors, and by the printer and the publisher of every newspaper, shall be deposited with the Registrar General prior to the first publication of a newspaper, and whenever, in any newspaper already registered, any change is made in any of the particulars required to be stated in the affidavit. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £25 nor more than £100. By the same statute it is also required that the printer and the publisher of a newspaper, together with two sufficient sureties, shall, prior to the publication of the newspaper, and also upon the insolvency of a surety and notice from the Chief Secretary, or upon the withdrawal of a surety, enter into recognizances before a Judge of the Supreme Court, or the Police Magistrate of the district, for payment of any fine or penalty that may be inflicted for printing or publishing any blasphemous or seditious libel. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20, together with all reasonable costs of discovering and prosecuting the offence.

2. Every person who has any printing press or types for printing is required by the above-mentioned statute to give notice thereof in writing, signed by himself and attested by a witness, to the Registrar General. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20. And every person who prints for publication or dispersion any paper or book is required to print his name and place of abode upon the front of every such paper if it be printed upon one side only, and upon the first and last leaf of every paper or book if there be more than one such leaf. The penalty for breach of this provision is a sum of not less than £5 nor more than £20.

The above provisions of the law have been hitherto wholly or in part disobeyed by a large number of newspaper proprietors, publishers, and printers. Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one month from this date the law will be strictly enforced against all offenders.

At a meeting of the Council of the city of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall, Swanston street, in the said city, on the 3rd day of December, 1866, at which were present:—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman William Williams, presiding; Aldermen John Harrison, George Hughes, John Thomas Smith, and George Wragge; Councillors Samuel Amess, William Bayles, James Stewart Butters, Orlando Fenwick, Robert Flockhart, Abraham Linnere, Thomas Moubay, Alexander McLean, Thomas McPherson, Thomas Reed, Henry Sanders, Alexander Kennedy Smith, Joseph Story, and Robert Walker, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered, that whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria, No. 20, intitled *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, Courts, and Alleys on Private Property within the City of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley on private property, in the city of Melbourne, shall not be or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively.

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 178, intitled *An Act to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore-recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and accessible from, and communicating with such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use or do commonly use the same: And that the word "owner," used in the said Act shall apply to and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of such street, court or alley, under the authority hereof, moneys of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession, accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expenses incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne, in the formation, drainage and repair of every such street, court, or alley, on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys, enumerated in the schedule to the order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of this the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys, enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed and marked B. Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction; paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley, shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 24-inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private entrances lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining street shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
