NOTICE TO MARINERS.

New Zealand, Province of Wellington.

FIXED LIGHT ON SOAMES' ISLAND, PORT NICHOLSON HARBOR. His Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified, that on the night of Saturday, the 17th day of February next, and every night thereafter, from the going away of daylight in the evening to the return of daylight in the morning, a light will be exhibited from the undermentioned lighthouse, the position and characteristics of which have been specified by John Halliday, Harbor Master of the Province of Wellington, as follows:—

PORT NICHOLSON HARBOR LIGHT.

The Lighthouse is situated on Soames' Island, and has been constructed and arranged chiefly as a leading light for vessels entering the port through the main channel. The light is catadioptric of the fourth order, showing a fixed white light in mid-channel, a fixed red light on the western and a fixed green light on the eastern shore, and will be exhibited from an octagonal tower of iron, painted white. The light will be about seventy-four (74) feet above high-water mark, and is visible in ordinary weather at a distance of ten (10) nautical miles, or four (4) miles outside Pencarrow Head Light.

Caution.—Masters of vessels entering the port through the main entrance are cautioned not to shut the White Light in after bringing Pencarrow Light to bear E.N.E. The White Light will lead in clear of all dangers and may be steered for until the Red Light on the Queen's Wharf bears W.S.W., when a course may be steered for any part of the anchorage as convenient. The bearings are magnetic. Variation, 15° E. in 1855.

UNITED COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall respectively be United Commons, under the following names, that is to say:—

THE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON OF BET-BET AND WAREEK.—The Wareek Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth day of March, 1861, and the fifth day of January, 1863, and the Bet-bet No. 4 Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the third day of June, 1861, and twenty-ninth day of May, 1865, are hereby united under the designation of the United Farmers' Common of Bet-bet and Wareek, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(66.M.1551.)

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF TEESDALE.—The common described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, as the Teesdale Farmers' Common, and the common described in another Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of November, 1865, as the Teesdale Town Common, are hereby united under the designation of the United Town and Farmers' Common of Teesdale, and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(66.N.491.)

TATYOON TEMPORARY COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion

of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and purchasers in the agricultural area of Tatooon, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The allotments and pieces of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1036 acres 1 rood 2½ perches, viz.:—Allotments 15, 26, 27, 35, 46, 57, 227, a reserve on the north of allotment 3, a reserve on the north of allotments 3 and 12, a reserve on the north of allotment 26, a reserve on the south of allotment 46, a reserve on the east of allotment 165, a reserve on the north of allotment 227, and a reserve on the south of allotment 226, all in the parish of Tatooon.—(66.M.1461.)

PYALONG FARMERS' COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, increase the common hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Pyalong Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date 21st January, 1862, is hereby increased by adding thereto two thousand (2000) acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing common; thence west thirty-six chains fifty links; thence north two hundred chains; thence east three hundred and thirty-four chains; thence south sixty-eight chains to the north-east angle of the Pyalong Town Common; thence by part of the north boundary of that common, bearing west to the most eastern boundary of the existing farmers' common; thence by that boundary and by the north and west boundaries thereof, bearing north-westerly, west, and south, to the point of commencement.—(65.K.14412.)

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. 3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. MANSFIELD DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE business of the Board at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it may become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

Clause 2. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held on the first Monday of every month at Two o'clock p.m.

Clause 3. Should a quorum not be present within one hour after the time appointed, the names of the members present shall be entered in the minute book.

Clause 4. The first business of all meetings of the board shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the chairman.

Clause 5. Special meetings of the board shall, on the requisition of three or more members, be convened by the clerk; the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition.

Clause 6. At the ordinary meetings of the board after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz. —

1. Reading and ordering on correspondence.
2. Reading and considering petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the chairman may bring before the meeting.
5. Motions of which notice shall have been given in writing.
6. Examination and passing of accounts.
7. Notices of motion.

Clause 7. Every petition addressed to the board shall be presented by one of the members, who shall be responsible for its being properly and respectfully worded.

Clause 8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave notice thereof, or some other member duly authorised by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

Clause 9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

Clause 10. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost any other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

Clause 11. No person, not being a member, shall be permitted to address the board without the consent of the majority of the board then present, and without giving notice in writing to the clerk of the board seven days previously, stating the subject matter of his address.

Clause 12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

Clause 13. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all points of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

Clause 14. Every motion or amendment shall be committed to writing, with the signature of the mover and seconder, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the board.

Clause 15. Any member may require the clerk to take down the particular words used by a member immediately on the same being uttered.

Clause 16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment. If the motion be carried, the business undisturbed shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the board; but if lost, the subject previously under consideration, or the next in order, shall be discussed before a subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained.

Clause 17. No member shall speak twice on the same question except in reply or personal explanation.

Clause 18. Any member who shall refuse to obey when called to order by the chairman, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, and who shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology when required to do so by the chairman, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

Clause 19. The voting shall in every case be by show of hands for and against the motion or amendment. Every motion or amendment, with the name of the mover and seconder, shall be entered in the minutes, and the votes shall be recorded if required by any member.

Clause 20. The original manuscript of every motion or amendment shall, if required, be laid on the table at the meeting at which it is to be confirmed, and may be destroyed after the minutes containing the said motions or amendments are confirmed.

Clause 21. Any member may protest against any resolution of the board by delivering the said protest in writing to the clerk duly signed, stating his reason or reasons for protesting against such resolution, and the clerk shall make an entry of the same in the minute book.

Clause 22. Any member may, without previous notice, move a call of the board for the consideration of any subject; and upon such motion being carried, the clerk shall give notice thereof to each member six clear days at least before the meeting for which such call is made, such notice to state the subject for consideration and the date and hour of meeting; and any member not present at such call of the board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable before any two justices of the peace; unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the board.

Clause 23. No motion, the effect of which shall be to rescind a former resolution of the board, shall be entertained unless

notice thereof, in writing, be given at a preceding meeting, and a call of the board made for the purpose.

Clause 24. It shall be competent for a majority of the board to suspend at any meeting one or more of the standing orders herein contained, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

Clause 25. All contracts amounting to £20 shall be made by tender, and advertised not less than twice in some paper circulating in the district, and notices calling for tenders shall also be posted on the Police Court and Post Office.

Clause 26. Every tender must be accompanied by a deposit of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the gross amount of the tender, which sum shall be returned in the event of the tender not being accepted, but should the tender be accepted such sum to be absolutely forfeited to the board if the tenderer fails to take up his contract within ten days after receiving a notification from the clerk that his tender has been accepted, but to be refunded to the contractor upon the certificate of the engineer of the satisfactory completion of the contract. In the event of the non-performance of the works from any cause whatsoever the board shall be entitled absolutely to retain such deposit as liquidated damages for breach of contract and to appropriate the same.

Clause 27. When any tender shall have been accepted by the board, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and also by the chairman and one other member, and the contractor shall also be required to sign the plans and specifications of the work for which his tender has been accepted.

Clause 28. Every tender to be addressed to the chairman of the board, and endorsed "Tender for—," and to be placed in a box specially provided and affixed to the board room so that tenders may be dropped into it from the outside. This box to have "Tender-box" painted on it, and to be secured with a patent lock of approved quality, the key of which shall be kept by the chairman, and such box not to be opened except at a meeting of the board.

Clause 29. Every tender must be on the printed form to be obtained at the office of the board, and must be filled up in accordance with the schedule attached to the specification, and no tender will be recognised unless made out in compliance with these conditions.

Clause 30. In the event of the contractor not completing his contract within the term stipulated in the conditions thereof, the engineer shall immediately report thereon to the board.

Clause 31. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member, and countersigned by the treasurer; and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the board, or by a committee duly empowered to do so.

Clause 32. The clerk, engineer, and every other officer and servant shall, when called upon, furnish official reports to the board. The collector shall also furnish detailed monthly reports showing the amount of the rates received by him during the month immediately preceding, the moneys paid to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates.

Clause 33. In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to apply once either personally or by letter for any rate due, and at the time of such application he shall furnish the party owing such rate with a written notice, showing the amount of rates due, describing the property on which the rates are owing, and demanding payment of such sum at the office of the board within 21 days after service of notice, and stating that in default of payment, legal proceedings for the recovery will be taken.

Clause 34. The collector shall every seven days pay over to the treasurer all moneys collected by him, and obtain a receipt for each separate payment.

Clause 35.
