SIR.—Her Majesty's Government being desirous of observing the strictest neutrality in the contest between Spain and the Republic of Chili, they propose, with the view of more effectually carrying into effect this principle, to interdict the armed ships and also the privateers of both parties from carrying prizes made by them into the ports, harbours, roadsteads or waters of the United Kingdom, or of any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions abroad.

I have accordingly to acquaint you that the Queen has been pleased to direct that orders, in conformity with the principles above stated, should forthwith be addressed to all proper authorities in the United Kingdom, and to Her Majesty's naval or other authorities in all quarters beyond the United Kingdom, for their guidance in the circumstances.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district thereinafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereinafter called subdivisions by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in and for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of October, 1857, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Caulfield Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of September, 1864, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act, in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into two subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Caulfield Road District into three soparate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of Her present Majesty, called An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Customs, it is amongst other things enacted that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, guncotton, military and naval stores, and other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation or Order of the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to prevent the introduction into the colony of the article known as Nitro-Glycerine: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation of Nitro-Glycerine into Victoria.
