PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field for, as the case may be] Common of " for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned to be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF PYALONG, comprising the Town Common of Pyalong, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the Farmers' Common of Pyalong described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-first day of January, 1862, and the nineteenth day of February, 1866. And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the abovementioned commons.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE UNITED GOLD FIELD COMMON OF LINTON'S, BROWN'S, SPRINGDALLAH, HAPPY VALLEY, LUCKY WOMAN'S, AND ITALIAN GULLY, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown Lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.—1,500 acres, more or less: Commencing at an angle of the existing common, the said angle bearing east one hundred and twenty-five chains from the north-east angle of the Moppianimum pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing east sixty-three chains; thence by a line bearing south to the Illibarook Creek; thence by that creek, bearing westerly to the most eastern boundary of the aforesaid existing common; and thence by that boundary bearing north to the point of commencement.—(66.N.3083.)

A higher mortality prevailed in March than in the corresponding month of any of the six previous years. This is no doubt partly due to the increase of population during the period. The ratio of mortality to population cannot however be accurately known until another census is taken.

Males and females died respectively in the proportions of 54 and 46 per cent. Fifty-seven per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 59 per cent. in March, 1865, 58 per cent. in March, 1864, 57 per cent. in March, 1863, 58 per cent. in March, 1862, 65 per cent. in March, 1861, and 61 per cent. in March, 1860.

Twenty-one deaths occurred on the 8th, and 20 on the 12th of the month. These were the days of highest mortality. Those of the lowest were the 5th, 17th and 31st, on each of which the number of recorded deaths was but 7.

The persons of 75 years old and upwards who died were as follow:—Two males aged 75, one of cancer in the mouth, and the other of disease of the brain; two females aged respectively 79 and 88, both of old age.

The violent deaths numbered 12, of which 10 were set down to accident, 1 to manslaughter and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A male child aged 6 died of accidental injuries to the chest, a farmer aged 21 of the effects of a fall from a

horse, an engineer aged 32 of a fractured skull caused by an engine, a storeman aged 39 of a fractured thigh, a laborer aged 39 of a ruptured liver in consequence of a fall, an engineer aged 44 of severe injuries to the face, an infant aged 1 year of a scald, and a laborer aged 35 of suffocation in the Penridge Stockade, an unknown male about 45 years old was found drowned, an infant 5 months old was suffocated by overlying, a carrier aged 31 was killed by a blow which fractured the orbital bone of the skull (verdict manslaughter), a male aged 45 committed suicide by strangulation.

The deaths in Public Institutions numbered 79, or nearly a fifth of the total mortality. Forty-one took place in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 14 in the Industrial Schools, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphan Asylum, 2 in the Penridge Stockade, and 2 in the hulk *Success*.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 220, of which 102, or about 46 per cent, were of males, and 118, or nearly 54 per cent, were of females. Of those dying, 115 were under one year of age, 68 were between one and two years, 19 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 168, of which 106, or about 63 per cent, were males, and 62, or nearly 37 per cent, were females; 14 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 6 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 4 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 was over eighty.
