HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government has directed the Queen's Proclamation, which is hereto subjoined, to be promulgated in Victoria By His Excellency's Command, J. A PROCLAMATION

For declaring Gold Coins made at the Branch Mint at Sydney, New South Wales, a Legal Tender within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and for imposing a Charge of Threepence per Ounce Troy of Standard Gold on the Coinage of Gold at the said Branch Mint, being a Charge sufficient to defray the Expenses of Coinage over and above the Expenses of Assay and Refining.

VICTORIA R. WHEREAS by an Order in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, We

have thought fit to order that a branch of our royal mint should be established at or near Sydney, in New South Wales: And whereas in the eighteenth year of our reign, by an Order in Council, dated the eighteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, we have thought fit to order that certain pieces of gold money should be coined at the said branch of our royal mint, to be called respectively Australian sovereigns and Australian half-sovereigns, and to be of the same respective

weights, fineness, and values with the sovereigns and half-sovereigns now current within this our realm:

And whereas, pursuant to and in virtue of the powers given in our said Orders in Council, it is provided that a coinage of the said Australian sovereigns and half-sovereigns shall be made, and that every such Australian sovereign shall have for the obverse our effigy, with the inscription, "Victoria, D.G. Britannia Regina, F.D.," and the date of the year, and for the reverse the word "Australia" placed in the centre of the piece, encircled by a laurel wreath, and surmounted by the royal crown with the inscription "Sydney Mint, One Sovereign," and with a graining on the edge; and that every such Australian half-sovereign shall have the obverse in every respect similar to that of the sovereign, and for the reverse the same word, "Australia" in the centre, encircled and surmounted in like manner, but for the inscription the words "Sydney Mint, Half Sovereign," and a graining on

And whereas pieces of gold money have been and will be coined at our said branch of the royal mint in pursuance of orders issued and to be issued:

No. 57.-MAY 18, 1866.-1.

And whereas by an Act made and passed in the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh years of our reign, intituled "An Act to enable Her Majesty to declare gold coins to be issued from Her Majesty's branch mint at Sydney, New South Wales, a legal tender for payments, and for other purposes relating thereto" it is provided that "it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by proclamation issued with the advice of her Privy Council, to declare that, after a date specified in such proclamation, gold coins made at the said branch mint at Sydney aforesaid, of designs approved by Her Majesty, and being of the same weight and fineness as are required by law with respect to gold coins of the same denominations made at Her Majesty's mint in London, are to be a legal tender for payments within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and upon such proclamation being issued gold coins, made of such designs and being of such weight and fineness as aforesaid, shall be a legal tender for payments accordingly ?

And whereas by the same Act it is further provided that "it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by proclamation issued with such advice as aforesaid, from time to time to impose on the coinage of gold at the said branch mint at Sydney a charge sufficient to defray the expenses of coinage over and above the expenses of assay and refining; and it shall be incumbent on the said deputy

master to coin gold at the charge so imposed:"

We therefore, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, have thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, and we do ordain, declare, and command, that from and after the date of the publication of this our proclamation in the London Gazette coins made at the said branch mint, of designs approved by us, at Sydney aforesaid, and being of the same weight and fineness as are required by law with respect to gold coins of the same denominations made at our mint in London, shall be a legal tender for payments within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

And we do hereby, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, by this our Royal Proclamation, impose on the coinage of gold at the said branch mint at Sydney the charge of Threepence per ounce troy of gold of standard fineness, being a charge sufficient to defray the expenses of coinage over and above the expenses of assay and refining.

Given at our Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, this third day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and in the twenty-ninth year of our reign.

By His Excellency Brigadier-General George Jackson Carey, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by. The Local Government. Act 1863, it, is amongst other things enacted, that, if any borough and any road district shall adjoin each other and form with the boundaries thereof respectively one continuous area, or if any borough shall lie surrounded by any road district, and, if the, council of such borough and the board of such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district be formed into one united district under the said Act, the same

may be done in like manner and with the like effect in all respects as is thereinbefore provided with regard to the union of two or more road districts; and for the purpose of such union such borough shall be deemed to have been a district, and the several wards thereof, if any, to have been subdivisions, under the said Act, and the several provisions of the said Act shall apply to the same accordingly: And whereas the Borough of Gisborne (the boundaries of which are described in schedule B of The Manicipal Corporations Mot 1863) is wholly surrounded by the Gisborne Road District, the boundaries of which are described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August, in the year 1863: And whereas the council of the said borough and the board of the said road district have by petitions under the respective common seals of the said council and board prayed the Governor in Council, in manner provided by the twelfth section of the above-recited Act, that the said borough and road district shall be constituted one united district: And whereas it seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an Order in Council this day, constituting the said borough and road district one district as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of the colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the constitution of the said Borough of Gisborne and the Gisborne Road District to be one district under the said Act, by the name in and by the said Order in Council assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE GISBORNE UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Brigadier-General George Jackson Carey, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being

a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of the colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough of Eaglehawk as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWEES AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following rates.—

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

11. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £100, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

111. On every, house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £300, a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Iv. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

V. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VI. Warehouses and stores not being domiciles shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

VII. Water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s, per 1000 gallons would be equal; to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per cuertee.

5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board with water, or who shall allow such person to take and carry away the same, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five

be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person receiving water from the board who shall sell the same to-any-other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five-pounds.

7. Any person not subject to the payment of a water-rate, who shall take or earry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, without written permission from the board so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with, or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any

leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. Lead-piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,00,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

14. Any person connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

15. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

MINING OPERATIONS WITHIN THE WATERSHED AREA AT YACKANDANDAH AUTHORISED.

AREA AT YACKANDANDAH AUTHORISMS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of The Mining Statute 1865
(29 Viot No. 291, § 15), His Excellency the Oilicer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has authorised the holders of miners' rights to occupy under the same and to prosecute mining operations upon Crown lands within the limits of the watershed exempted from mining by the Order in Council of 15th October, 1860, in connection with the public reservoirs, Nos. 1 and 2, Yackandandah, on the following conditions:—

following conditions:—

1. That persons-shall-not mine upon or occupy any portion of the said exempted land within a distance of half a mile of the embankments of either of the said reservoirs.

2. The persons occupying or mining upon any lands within the said watershed shall not interfere in any way with the reservoirs, nor pollute the water stored therein, nor suffer any sludge or tailings or polluted water from their workings to flow into the reservoirs.

3. The persons mining or occupying as aforesaid shall not

into the reservoirs.

3. The persons mining or occupying as aforesaid shall not construct any dams or races within the limits of the said watershed, nor in any way obstruct or divert the natural flow of the water into such reservoirs.

4. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any-mining surveyor or other authorised officer.

5. All or any of the holders of miners' rights mining within the said watershed shall stop their works when requested so to do by the mining surveyor or other authorised officer, whenever it shall appear that the workings are not being carried out with due precaution against any contingent damage to the said reserve.

6. In case any person so mining or occupying shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or to occupy any portion of the said exempted lands.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten o'clock am. to Four o'clock p.m.

6. The charges may be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the same.

7. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery, is to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the charges set forth in schedule marked A.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

A LL persons entitled to depasture stock upon the above commons shall be permitted to do so, subject to the following regulations, and on payment of the undermentioned fees

An commons shall be permitted to do so, subject to the following regulations, and on payment of the undermentioned fees.

2. Each person shall be allowed to run one head of cattle for every acre he may have in cultivation up to twenty acres; and from twenty to sixty acres one head for every two acres; or an equivalent in horses, one horse to reckon as two head of cattle.

3. No person shall be allowed to run more than forty (40) head of cattle on the commons, nor more than twenty (20) horses; neither will bulls or entires be permitted to depasture thereon without the written consent of the managers.

4. The fees charged for depasturing stock shall be a uniform rate of five shillings per head per annum for horned cattle of all ages; and ten shillings per head per annum for horses of all ages, payable to the managers half-yearly in advance, viz.—on or after the first day of April and the first day of October in each year respectively.

5. The herdsman will take delivery of stock at the commons stockyard, on Tuesday of each week, between the hours of Nine in the morning and Four in theafternoon. A written description of each beast, with their brands, must be given at the same time, together with an order for their admission, signed by one of the managers. The owner will be required to assist in branding the cattle with the commons pitch brand, and in no case will the herdsman be liable for poundage fees for any stock that is not delivered into his charge as aforesaid.

6. After delivery has been taken by the herdsman, no person (except those specially mentioned hereafter) will be allowed to remove stock from the commons without first applying to the herdsman for information as to the portion of the commons the required cattle or horses may be running; and before removal, they must be driven to the commons stockyard for the purpose of having the same entered in the delivery book.

7. All stock must be fire-branded with their owner's brand, and no person or persons will be allowed to transfer his or their depasturin

9. Any person interfering with or disturbing the common stock during the muster will render himself liable to a penalty of One pound for so doing.

10. In the event of stock being impounded after having been duly delivered into the herdsman's charge, in accordance with Rule 5, the herdsman will release the same at his own expense, provided said stock be not impounded by their owner or any person on his that.

11. Cattle or horses returning to their owners, after being given in charge to the herdsman, will be driven back to the commons three times by the herdsman; and should such cattle or horses be impounded after having been so driven back as aforesaid, the herdsman will not be liable for any impounding fees that may be due thereon, nor be supposed to release said stock from pound until the same be re-delivered into his charge by the owner.

12. Commoners to whom Rule 6 does not apply are those requiring their milking cattle, or working bullocks, or horses daily, and for such stock the herdsman will not be accountable in the event of their being impounded.

13. Owners of stock resident in the vicinity of the commons will not be allowed to drive their herds or flocks across the commons to water without first applying to the managers for permission to do so. The managers shall, if they see fit, grant the application, and then mark out a roadway, which the application and then mark out a roadway, which the applicant shall be strictly required to keep.

14. The herdsman shall be required to compel persons in charge of travelling stock to keep the same within the limits prescribed by the 78th clause of The Land Act 1862, whilst passing over the commons; but residents of the district desirous of removing cattle or sheep from one portion of their land to another must keep the direct road leading thereto, and such stock will not be considered as travelling.
