THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Brigadier-General **GEORGE JACKSON CAREY**, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's Troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added; and it is also enacted, that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save wherein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of December, 1865, the Shire of Glenlyon was constituted: And whereas it has seemed fit to make an addition on the southern side of the said shire: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Shire of Glenlyon by the extension of its southern boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said shire added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:-

Commencing on the northern boundary of the county of Grant at a point due south of the south-east angle of the borough of Daylesford; thence north to the south-east angle of the said borough; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly, by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the borough of Daylesford, to the west boundary of section VII, parish of Wombat; thence north by the said west boundary and a direct line to the south side of block 19 in the parish of Holcombe; thence due west to the centre of Middleton Creek; thence northerly by the centre of Middleton Creek to the north angle of block 2, in the parish of Holcombe; thence by a line due north to the northern boundary of the said parish; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Burke; thence further east by the north boundary of the parish of Burke to the south-west angle of the parish of Drummond; thence north by the west boundary of the last-named parish, and east by its north boundary to a point in the centre of the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of that river to its source; thence by the south-western boundary of the Shire of Kyneton to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence by the northern boundaries of the counties of Bourke and Grant westerly to the commencing point, excluding the borough of Daylesford.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The deaths in Melbourne and suburbs during April numbered 347, against 388 in March, 381 in February, and 470 in January. They exceeded by 25 the average of the month during seven years, but this is not a large excess considering the increase of population. The mean temperature in April was about a degree and a half higher than the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males and 46 per cent. of females. Fifty-four per cent. were of children who had not arrived at their fifth year, against 60 per cent. in April, 1865, 62 per cent. in April, 1864, 58 per cent. in April, 1863, 53 per cent. in April, 1862, 63 per cent. in April, 1861, and 61 per cent. in April, 1860.

The largest daily mortality was on the 13th, when 19 deaths took place. Seventeen also occurred on the 30th and 16 on the 23rd. The smallest mortality was on the 17th and 25th, on each of which the recorded number of deaths was 6.

The mortality of old persons was more than usually high during the month. Deaths of no less than eight at ages ranging from 75 years upwards were recorded. The particulars of these are as follow:—A male aged 75 died of old age, one aged 80 of bron-

chitis, one aged 85 of paralysis of the bladder, and one aged 96 of old age. A female aged 75 died of disease of the liver, one aged 76 died of old age, one aged 84 died of old age, and one aged 87 of chronic bronchitis.

The violent deaths numbered 11, as follows:—A musician aged 25 died of a fractured skull caused by an accidental fall in the street, a cabinet-maker aged 37 died of a rupture of the intestines caused by violence, a wheelwright aged 54 died of the effects of a fracture of the leg and ribs. A child under 2 years old was accidentally drowned at Fitz Roy, also a seaman aged 27 in Hobson's Bay, a lumper aged 32 was found drowned in the Yarra River, a female servant aged 26 died from the effects of a scald, an infant a few hours old died of suffocation, a hawkier aged 46 was accidentally suffocated in a drain whilst intoxicated, a female child aged 2 years died from the bite of an insect, an editor aged 35 shot himself whilst in a fit of temporary insanity.

Sixty-seven deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole occurred in Public Institutions as follows: Melbourne Hospital 43, Lying-in Hospital 2, Benevolent Asylum 6, Immigrants' Home 1, Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum 6, Royal Park Lunatic Asylum 1, Industrial Schools, 8.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 187, of which 98, or about 52 per cent., were of males, and 89, or nearly 48 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 99 were under one year of age, 55 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 160, of which 90, or about 56 per cent., were males, and 70, or nearly 44 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten years, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 10 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 12 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were eighty and upwards.

Thirty-two deaths were set down to phthisis in both months.

Every person so entitled as in the preceding clause to commonage shall be permitted to depasture horses, cattle, or sheep on the common according to the following scale, viz.:—One horse, or one head of cattle, or four sheep or goats to every ten acres owned or tenanted by him or held under license; the holder of business, publican, or splitter's license two head of cattle or two horses, or their equivalent in other stock.

3. The assessment on stock depasturing on the above common to be as follows, viz.:—

For every horse or mule over twelve months old 3s. per year.
For every head of cattle over six months old 2s. "
For every sheep or goat over six months old 1s. "

4. Travellers depasturing stock on the said common shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, but shall be liable to pay sixpence per head for horses or horned cattle and one penny per head for sheep or goats for every day beyond that time. The managers shall always have power to prevent travelling stock from remaining on the common for a longer period than twenty-four hours, and in no case shall the same horses, cattle, or sheep be allowed to recross the common within the space of one month from the time of their having last depastured thereon.

5. No stock of any kind shall be allowed to enter on the common without twenty-four hours' notice being previously given to the managers or herdsman.

6. All assessments to be paid half-yearly in advance. The half-year to commence on the first day of February and the first day of August in each year.

7. All holders of stock depasturing on the common shall muster them at a time and place appointed by the managers or herdsman, of which due notice shall be given them, for the purpose of branding the same with the brand of the common should the managers or herdsman require such to be done. Horses and mules to be exempted from common brand.

8. All stock on which the assessment fees are not paid within seven days after time when due, or which have not been mustered at the time and place appointed by the managers or herdsman, may be impounded.

9. All entire horses or bulls, over six months old, found running on the common without a written consent from the managers shall be impounded.

10. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any stock that may be depastured on the common.

11. The managers shall give a printed receipt in each case showing the number and description of stock and the amount paid in respect thereof.

12. All dead or diseased cattle, &c., found on the common, the owners of which neglect or refuse to remove the same within twenty-four hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman shall be burnt, removed, or impounded, and the owner be liable to the penalties mentioned in clause 129 of the Land Act of 1862.

13. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or negligent of his duties, they may remove or discharge him forthwith, or after one week's notice, as the exigency of the case may require.

14. A record to be kept by the managers or herdsman showing the number and description of stock, and the amount paid in respect thereof.

15. Special licenses may be granted by the managers when considered necessary and with the sanction of the council.

16. The managers to meet at least once every month to transact any business that may come before them.

17. The managers to hand in to the secretary of the shire on the third Wednesday in August in each year the various books of account kept by them in respect of the commons, together with a statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past year for the purpose of being audited by the shire auditors.

18. All monies received by the managers to be paid to the treasurer of the shire half-yearly within one month after collection of the same.

19. The managers shall furnish such security as the council may determine.

20. The managers of the common for the time being may have a discretionary power to increase the number of stock to be carried according to the capabilities of the common, such increase to be regulated in accordance with Rule 3 as to the number of sheep, &c., &c., which each party shall be entitled to depasture.

21. The herdsman, managers, or servants of the managers may have authority to impound all straying unauthorised stock, a registry of which the herdsman will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.

The foregoing rules and regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Stawell Shire Council, held at the Office, Quartz Reefs, on the fifteenth day May, 1866.




