EXTENSION OF THE FISHERIES ACT.

PROCLAMATION

His Excellency Brigadier-General GEORGE JACKSON CAREY, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Commanding Her Majesty's troops in the Australian Colonies, and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate the Laws for the Protection of Fisheries and Game*, it is amongst other things enacted that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra-yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Salt-water Rivers, in the colony of Victoria, or in any or either of their respective tributaries, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by Proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the provisions of the 11th clause of the said Act, he shall forfeit such net, and also such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall think fit: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above-recited provisions of the said act, being the 11th clause thereof, to the River Barwon (exclusive of the lakes), to the Leigh, Moorabool, Little and Yarrowee Rivers, and to Spring Bream, Airey's, and Swampy Creeks.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown Land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the

Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

ROKEWOOD TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the township of Rokewood shall be a Town Common for the use of all householders in the township of Rokewood:—(66.M.6706.)

The deaths in May numbered 73 less than in the same month of 1865. They were slightly in excess of the average mortality during seven years, but not more so than might be expected from the increased population. They were fewer by 15 than those which occurred in April.

The month was warmer than the same month in any year of the previous six. The mean temperature was higher by nearly 3° than the average of May, extending over a period of seven years.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Forty-seven per cent. of the deaths were of children under five, against 56 per cent. in May, 1865; 58 per cent. in May, 1864; 52 per cent. in May, 1863; 54 per cent. in May, 1862; 53 per cent. in May, 1861; and 56 per cent. in May, 1860. It will be observed that this is the only year of the past seven in which the mortality of children under five in May was less than half the total mortality during that month.

A larger mortality occurred on the 26th than on any other day. The number of deaths was 21. The next highest number was 16 on the 25th, then 15 on the 18th and 31st. The smallest mortality was on the 1st, 7th, and 21st, on the first of which days only 5 deaths, and on each of the two last only 6 deaths took place.

The oldest person who died during the month was a female, aged 85, of old age; the next oldest was a male, aged 81, of softening of the brain; then a female, aged 80, of old age; a male, aged 77, of old age; and a female, aged 70, of paralysis.

The violent deaths numbered 13, of which 11 are believed to have been accidental and 2 suicidal. Of the accidental deaths, 4 were from fractures and contusions, viz., one of a male, aged 26, of a fractured skull, arising from a fall from a horse; one of a pointsman, aged 33, of an accident by a train; one of a female, aged 33, of the effects of a cut on the head, occasioned by a fall when

drunk; and one of a female, aged 70, of a fractured thigh. Two were from burns, viz., one of a female, aged 25, and another of a female, aged 46. Two were from drowning, viz., one of a boy, aged 16 months, at Fitz Roy; and one of a boy, aged 4 years, at Richmond. Three were from suffocation, all of infants, aged respectively 25 days, 8 weeks, and 3½ months. Of the supposed suicidal deaths, one was of a constable, aged 35 years, of drowning in the Yarra; and one of a bottle gatherer, aged 50, of a pistol-shot wound in the head, inflicted during a fit of temporary insanity.

Sixty-three deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, occurred in Public Institutions as follow: Melbourne Hospital 34, Lying-in Hospital 4, Benevolent Asylum 9, Yarra Bend Asylum 4, Royal Park Asylum 2, Immigrants' Home 2, Industrial Schools 4, and Melbourne Gaol 4.

The deaths of children under five years numbered 157, of which 92, or nearly 59 per cent., were of males, and 65, or about 41 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 89 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 175, of which 91, or 52 per cent., were males, and 84, or 48 per cent., were females; twenty-four were between five and ten years, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 11 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 7 were between fifty and fifty-five, 6 were between fifty-five and sixty, 6 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

The mortality from zymotic diseases rose from 35½ per cent. of that from all causes in April, to 37 per cent. in the month under review. The number of deaths from this class of complaints was however the same in both months. Attention is drawn to the increased mortality from scarlatina and diphtheria, the number of deaths from which was 26 in May against 17 in April; also to the fact of 3 deaths being attributed to croup and 3 to cholera in May, whilst no death was set down to either of those causes in April. Only 19 deaths were referred to phthisis in the month under review against 32 in each of the two previous months.

In the event of supplies ordered under these contracts not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the railway storekeeper, on the order of the secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

12. BACCHUS MARSH AND MADDINGLEY DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

THE following Bye-laws were made and passed at a meeting of the board of the above road district, holden Saturday, the 9th June, 1866:—

1. That the meetings of the board be held on every alternate Saturday, at the Court House, Bacchus Marsh, at 2 p.m.
2. The minutes of every preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
3. At all meetings of the board, unless otherwise provided for by law, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up the reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.
4. Every communication from the ratepayers of the district addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being properly worded.
5. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until at least one week's notice has been given, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and if necessary that it be referred to a committee.
6. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board be taken separately on each.
7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of the former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may deem necessary to bring under consideration.
8. Notice of motion shall be given in writing to the clerk at meetings of the board fourteen days previous to the discussion of such motion, and all notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.
9. No notice entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the business paper.
10. The mover of any notice which shall be referred to a committee, shall, during the discussion of such motion, be a member of such committee.
11. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the meeting.
12. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order and practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument, or the sense of the majority of the meeting may be taken if moved and seconded.
13. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, and personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.
14. Any member who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, and who, if required by the chairman, shall refuse to withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
15. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being spoken.
16. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign, and deliver it to the clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the board.
17. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the board in support thereof.
18. No motion or amendment shall be discussed unless it be seconded.
19. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.
20. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, unless by way of explanation or reply to any original motion or amendment of which he may have been the mover; and the chairman shall call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time. After the reply, the amendment or original motion shall be put to the vote.
21. Any member may of right require the production of the documents of the board relating to the question under discussion.
22. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.
23. The board shall vote by show of hands, unless the majority are in favor of vote by ballot. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the board, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all members (if a division is called) shall be entered in the minutes.
24. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but on the question being put, if the motion is negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, as the case may be, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.
25. Any member may recall his protest against any decision of the board, provided the same be made before the next meeting of the board and be couched in respectful language. Notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution. All protests shall be entered in the minute book of the board.

26. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the Treasurer, and no such cheques shall be given unless passed at a regular meeting of the board.

27. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof, legal proceedings shall be taken for its recovery. The collector shall once a week at least pay to the treasurer of the board all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the clerk with an account of such moneys.

28. The treasurer shall present a statement of monetary affairs of the board at each ordinary meeting of the board.

29. In all cases of contract, the contractor shall pay to the treasurer of the board a deposit of ten per cent. on the amount of the contract, which deposit shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and only repaid to the contractor when he obtains the engineer's certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

30. Any one or more of the standing orders may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.
