ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERA-TION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 22nd of October, 1866, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 29th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

No. 295.—An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament, and for other purposes. [Assented to 1st June, 1866.]

No. 296. Añ'Act to remove Doubts concerning the Law relating to the Grant of Land Certificates to Volunteers. [Assented to 1st June, 1866.]

No. 297. An Act to alter the style and title of "The Australasian Fire and Life Insurance Company" and for other purposes. [Assented to 1st June, 1866.]

No. 299. An Act to protect the Rights of Inventors of Articles exhibited at the Intercolonial Exhibition and at divers Local Exhibitions in Victoria in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. [Assented to 1st June, 1866.]
