## REGULATION AS TO LICENSES TO ASSIGN, ETC., GOLD MINING OR MINERAL LEASES.

THE Governor in Council has made the following Regulation relative to the Fee to be charged for a License to assign or otherwise part with or encumber Gold Mining Leases or Mineral Leases:—

**HOLDERS OF LEASES TO PAY A FEE OF £1 FOR A LICENSE TO ASSIGN, ETC.**

Any person or persons, being the lawful holder or holders of any gold mining lease or mineral lease, who shall desire to assign, set over, sublet, mortgage, charge, or otherwise part with or encumber such indenture of lease or the premises thereby demised, or any part or parts thereof, shall make application, in writing, to the Minister of Mines, for the necessary license, under the Hand and Seal of the Governor, and at the same time forward such proof of title as may be necessary to show that the legal interest in the land the subject of the lease is at the time vested in the said applicant or applicants.

The sum of One pound sterling (£1) to be appropriated as a fee for the preparation of such license should accompany the application.

#### BOROUGH OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW NO. 28.—FOR REGULATING THE MARKET FOR THE SALE OF GARDEN PRODUCE, MEAT, ETC., AND FOR FIXING AND LEVYING RATES, TOLLS, AND DUES, IN RESPECT OF SUCH MARKET.

Adopted and passed by the Borough Council of Belfast this 21th day of September, 1867.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of Victoria, 27th Victoria No. 184, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions*, the council of any borough are empowered to pass bye-laws for the regulation of markets and of buildings erected thereon, and for levying market dues: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the Borough Council of Belfast, that from and after the date of the publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette*, the following regulations shall be in force respecting the aforesaid market, and the said council shall have power to levy the tolls, rates, and dues, hereinafter specified in respect of the goods taken thereto for sale.

1. Name of market, and under whose management it is to be conducted.—The market shall be called the "Belfast Market," and

shall be under the control of the Belfast Borough Council, and of the inspector or other officers who may from time to time be appointed for the purposes of more direct supervision.

2. *Time when market shall be open.*—The said market shall be open for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say, butchers' meat, pork, poultry, butter, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, and all other garden produce, every Wednesday and Saturday from sunrise to sunset, or on any other day or hour which may from time to time be fixed by regulation. Any person selling or offering for sale any fruit, vegetable, or other marketable commodity, within the precincts of the said market, before the hour for opening or after the hour for closing the same, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law.

3. *Stalls, shops, &c., to be cleansed.*—Any persons occupying the market stall, within one hour after the opening of said market, and also previously to leaving the market, thoroughly cleanse the space or stall occupied by them.

4. *Where refuse is to be deposited.*—A space within the said market site, to be called the "Refuse Depot," shall be set apart and enclosed for the receipt of all rubbish and refuse matter produced within the said market; and no person or persons occupying the said market shall deposit any rubbish or refuse matter in any other place than said refuse depot.

5. *Obstructions.*—No person or persons shall place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the said market, nor shall sweep or cause to be swept any dirt or rubbish into any of the gutters, streets, or footways, nor drive any hook, nail, or peg in any wood of any stalls, nor remove from such stall any hooks, nails, or pegs, or nails that may be inserted at the time of commencement of lease, without the sanction of the properly appointed officer of said borough council.

6. *Rates, tolls, &c., to be imposed.*—The Belfast Borough Council shall and are hereby empowered and authorized to impose and collect all such rates, rents, tolls, and dues, as specified in table A.

7. *Hawking during market hours.*—Any person other than a licensed hawkker who shall sell or expose for sale in any place within the limits of the borough (except in his own dwelling-place or shop) any articles in respect of which tolls or dues are by this bye-law authorized to be taken in the market, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law, hawkkers of fish excepted.

8. *Inspector to be appointed; duties of inspector.*—The Belfast Borough Council shall and are hereby empowered to appoint, for the more direct supervision of said market, an officer, to be called the "Market Inspector," whose duties will be—

1. To see that each and every of the clause of this bye-law is observed, and to proceed legally against any person or persons who may be guilty of any breach or neglect thereof.

2. To receive and collect all moneys accruing from tolls, rents, and dues paid by parties selling produce in said market; to hand over to the Town Clerk all moneys so collected once a week, or as often as the Borough Council may hereafter direct.

3. And to obey generally the instructions which may from time to time be issued by the said council for his guidance.

9. *Unwholesome meat, &c.*—Any person or persons selling or exposing for sale in the market any unwholesome meat or other provisions shall be liable to the penalties provided by the Municipal Institutions Act No. 184.

10. *Breach or neglect of bye-law.*—Any person committing any breach or neglect of the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
