The mortality during August, although lower than during July, was above the average. The temperature in the shade was nearly a degree higher than the mean during eight years.

Males and females died in the same relative proportions as in July, namely, 53 and 47 per cent. of the whole mortality respectively. Thirty-nine per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 44 per cent. in August, 1866; 49 per cent. in August, 1865; 34 per cent. in August, 1863; 43 per cent. in August, 1863; 43 per cent. in August, 1863; 43 per cent. in August, 1860; 49 per cent. in August, 1861; and 49 per cent. in August, 1860.

Fifteen deaths was the highest number recorded for any one day, viz., for the 12th. The lowest number recorded was 2 for the 30th.

Five persons, all males, died at the age of 75 years or upwards. The following are their exact ages and the complaints given as having caused their deaths:—75 years, of bronchitis; 75 years, of dysentery; 79 years, of old age; 90 years, of paralysis; 99 years, of old age.

The violent deaths numbered:12, of which 9 are supposed to have been accidental, 2 homicidal, and 1 suicidal. The following are the particula:s:—A female infant, aged 60 weeks, died from injuries caused by being thrown from a dray; a boy, aged 5, was killed by a kick from a horse; a boy, aged 7, by being thrown from a horse; a lad, aged 16, by a fall from a cart whilst driving; a lad, aged 16, died of an injury to the spine; a timber salesman, aged 33, of an injury from a dray-wheel; a male, aged 51, of the effects of a fall down stairs; an infant, aged 48 weeks, of a scald; an infant, aged 5 days, was suffocated in bed; a newly-born infant was murdered by suffocation; a female, aged 37, was poisoned by antimony (husband committed for trial for murder); a male, aged 35, committed suicide by drowing.

Fifty-five deaths or 21 per cent. of the whole number recorded took place in public institutions, viz.:—33 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 2 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrant's Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.
