## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and may vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., X., of Part I. of the said Statute to the undermentioned towns in the Shire of Waranga, viz.:-

The Town of Murchison,  
The Town of Rushworth,  
The Town of Whroo.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEAT STACK BURNT AT CARISBROOK.

ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS about half-past One o'clock in the morning of Friday, the 13th of September last, a Fire took place on the farm of Henry Chalk, at Carisbrook, by which a Stack of Wheat was destroyed: And whereas at an inquest held to investigate the origin of the fire, a verdict was returned to the effect that it was wilfully and maliciously caused: And whereas Mr. Chalk has offered a Reward of One hundred pounds for the detection of the perpetrator of the crime above described: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds (supplemental to the amount offered by the owner of the burnt property) will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of causing the said fire.

His Excellency the Governor will also, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, grant a Free Pardon to any person implicated in the crime above described (not being the person who actually set fire to the property) who will give the required information.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.
