SHOOTING AT WITH INTENT TO KILL. TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS about Nine o'clock on the night of Wednesday, the 27th of November, 1867, several Gunshots were fired from the building known as the Protestant Hall, corner of Stephen and Little Collins streets, Melbourne, by some person or persons unknown: And whereas several parties were wounded by the said shots: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of the above offence.

PERSONS desirous of shipping arms or other warlike stores to New Zealand are hereby cautioned that it is necessary to obtain from the proper officer in New Zealand a license for the importation of articles coming under the above designation, before applying to this department for a license to export the same.

Intimation has been received from the Government of New Zealand that any warlike stores imported into that colony without such previous license for importation will be seized.
