FEE FOR A GATE ON OR ACROSS A PROCLAIMED OR SURVEYED ROAD.

IN pursuance of the 70th section of *The Amending Land Act* 1865, the Governor in Council has by Order dated the 28th of January, 1867, rescinded a previous Order of the 11th December, 1865 (published in the *Gazette* of 15th December, 1865), as to Gates on or across Proclaimed or Surveyed Roads, and has made the following Regulation in lieu thereof, viz.:

Every person who, with the consent in writing of the Board of Land and Works, shall, in pursuance of *The Amending Land Act* 1865, erect or continue any gate or gates on or across any proclaimed road or any surveyed road, shall pay in advance an Annual fee not exceeding Five pounds nor less than One pound, according to the determination of the Board of Land and Works, for every gate so erected or continued.

GISBORNE CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GISBORNE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

BEFORE any interment shall take place, application for permission shall be made to the secretary a reasonable time previously, when an order will be given to the applicant upon payment of the proper charges.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

3. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton before sunset of the day previous to the burial.

4. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year.

5. The procession will be expected to arrive at the cemetery at the hour appointed for the funeral.

6. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained and kept as private burial places; and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed thereon in accordance with these rules and regulations.

7. Permission to have a private burial place will be granted at the office of the secretary in the form and to the effect set forth in schedule A annexed upon payment of the proper fees.

8. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

10. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or tablet, and a plan of every monument, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.

12. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

14. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.

15. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the grounds and a register will be kept by the secretary.

17. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
