Twenty-one out of the twenty-four deaths registered in Collingwood were of children under three years of age, diarrhoea being the chief cause of mortality. Ten out of the twenty deaths registered in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Fifteen out of the nineteen deaths in North Melbourne, and all the deaths registered at Prahran, were of children under three years of age. Diarrhoea and dysentery are on the increase at Richmond. The health of Emerald Hill is reported as much improved.

3. All charges or fees must be paid at the time of giving the order, or before the ground or vault be opened, except such as may be remitted under the twentieth section of the *Cemeteries Statute*.

4. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. till Five p.m.; and the funeral procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the interment.

5. The cemetery will be open to the public on Sundays from Ten a.m. till sunset; but admission may be obtained on other days within all reasonable hours, upon application to the person in charge.

6. No graves will be allowed to be of a less depth than six feet.

7. Before any vault shall be made, or any monument, tombstone, tablet, or fence be erected, a certificate of permission must be obtained from the trustees; and the same shall state upon what conditions it be granted.

A very high rate of mortality prevailed in Melbourne and suburbs during January. The deaths exceeded by 129 those in December; they were also more numerous than in any previous month of January, and exceeded the average of that month in eight years by 244.

The mean temperature was about half a degree above the average. It was not so high as in the month of January during the four years from 1860 to 1863 inclusive, but was higher than in that month of the three subsequent years. The atmospheric pressure was slightly higher than in the same month of any year of the previous seven.

The month has been more fatal to females than to males. Deaths of the former numbered 354 against 333 of the latter, the respective proportions being 52 and 48 per cent. It is unusual for the mortality of males to be exceeded by that of females, and that circumstance has only occurred twice before during the last eight years, namely, in February, 1861, and September, 1862. The excess of female mortality in the month under review was confined to that of children under five. Beyond that age more males died than females.

Seventy-five per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age. This is a higher relative rate than has been reached in any previous month of January. In January, 1866, the corresponding proportion was 65½ per cent.; in January, 1865, it was 65 per cent.; in January, 1864, and in January, 1863, it was 64 per cent.; in January, 1862, it was 68 per cent.; in January, 1861, it was 71 per cent.; and in January, 1860, it was 73 per cent.

The large number of 32 deaths occurred on the 12th and on the 25th. The next highest number was 28 on the 2nd, 9th, 24th, and 27th; then 26 on the 11th, 15th, and 19th. The smallest number of deaths in one day was 11 on the 4th, then 12 on the 14th.

Eight persons of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, as follow:—a male aged 75 of natural decay; another at the same age of apoplexy; one aged 76 of apoplexy; and one aged 80 of phthisis. A female aged 76 died of dysentery; one at the same age of bronchitis; and another of old age; also one aged 82 of bronchitis.

The violent deaths during the month numbered 13. Of these three were believed to be suicidal, and the remainder accidental. The following are the particulars of the latter:—A female child, aged 3, was run over by a railway train; a boy of 12, described as a merchant's clerk, died of lockjaw caused by injuries received during the performance of gymnastic exercises; a woman, aged 33, died of a burn caused by her clothes catching fire; a child of a year old was poisoned by an overdose of opium; a boy, aged 5, was drowned in the Saltwater River; a girl, aged 5, in the Darebin Creek; a girl aged 9, a baker aged 42, and a male teacher aged 57, in the Yarra; and a contractor, aged 43, in Port Phillip Bay. The suicidal deaths were as follow:—A gentleman, aged 19, shot himself; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 30, drowned himself in the Yarra; a carpenter, aged 35, cut his throat.

Sixty-eight deaths, or nearly a tenth of the whole, occurred in public institutions, as follow:—Melbourne Hospital 29, Lying-in Hospital 4, Benevolent Asylum 1, Immigrants' Home 10, Immigration Hospital 2, Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum 4, Carlton Lunatic Asylum 1, Industrial Schools 9, Industrial Home 1, Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum 3, Military Barracks 1, Melbourne Gaol 3.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 512, of which 240, or nearly 47 per cent., were of males, and 272, or about 53 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 245 were under one year of age, 177 were between one and two years, 51 were between two and three, 26 were between three and four, and 13 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 175, of which 93, or about 53 per cent., were males, and 82, or nearly 47 per cent., were females; 38 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 17 were between thirty-five and forty, 13 were between forty and forty-five, 6 were between forty-five and fifty, 9 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 6 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, 2 were eighty and upwards.

Over 58 per cent. of the deaths were referred to zymotic diseases, against less than 53 per cent. in December. Measles caused 148 deaths against 135 in December; scarlatina and diphtheria caused 45 against 25, and dysentery and diarrhoea 165 against 96. Deaths from developmental diseases also increased in numbers. Of these, 44 were caused by atrophy and debility against 29 in December. Local diseases were of about equal fatality in both months. The mortality from constitutional diseases declined in January. Under this head deaths from phthisis numbered 30 against 34 in December.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

ALL charges must be paid to the person in charge when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees, through the person in charge. A certificate permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.

8. The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug at an extra expense of Fifteen shillings; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition, at the expense of the owner.

10. Wooden fences allowed; but if not kept in proper repair will be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone, granite, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unbecoming or inappropriate; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper or composition clamps must be used.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, paling, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, or guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

15. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

17. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

18. No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.
