W HEREAS by the Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria, it is aunongs tother things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the first day of February, 1864, the Circuit Court District of Beechworth was altered: And whereas by another Order in Council made on the third day of December, 1866, the Circuit Court District of Sale was defined: And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the said districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the above-mentioned Orders, and doth appoint that the limits of the undermentioned districts, within which Circuit Courts shall be holden, shall be those hereinafter defined, that is to say:—
