BEECHWORTH AND SALE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICTS ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of March, 1867.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary; And whereas by an Order in Council made on the first day of February, 1864, the Circuit Court District of Beechworth was altered: And whereas by another Order in Council made on the third day of December, 1866, the Circuit Court District of Sale was defined: And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the said districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the above-mentioned Orders, and doth appoint that the limits of the undermentioned districts, within which Circuit Courts shall be holden, shall be those hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF SALE.—Commencing at Cape Patterson on the sea-coast; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence by the latter boundary to Mount Baw-baw; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Useful; thence by the range dividing the sources of the McAlister River from those of Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Buller; thence by a straight line northerly to Mount Howitt; thence by the Great Dividing Range to Mount Smyth; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Feathertop; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Nelson; thence by the water-shed into Snowy Creek to Mount Wills;

thence by the water-shed on the northern side of Wombat Creek to the Mitta-mitta River; thence, crossing the Mitta-mitta River, by the water-shed on the northern side of the Gibbo River, following the said water-shed round easterly and south-easterly to Mount Hope; thence by a straight line easterly to the Cobboras; thence by the Great Dividing Range to Forest Hill; thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe, being the boundary between Victoria and New South Wales; thence by the sea-coast to Cape Patterson, the commencing point.

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH.—Commencing at the source of the River Murray; thence by that river to the River Goulburn; thence by the River Goulburn to Creighton's Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by the Dividing Range to the western arm of the Devil's River; thence by the western arm of the Devil's River, the River Goulburn, and the Jerusalem River, to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Smyth; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Feathertop; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Nelson; thence by the water-shed into Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence by the water-shed on the northern side of Wombat Creek to the Mitta-mitta River; thence, crossing the Mitta-mitta River, by the water-shed on the northern side of the Gibbo River following the said water-shed round easterly and south-easterly to Mount Hope; thence by a straight line easterly to the Cobboras; thence by the Great Dividing Range to Forest Hill; thence to the source of the River Murray, the commencing point.

And the Honorable George Higinbotham, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
