The Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs do hereby give notice, that the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury have directed that on and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, a duplicate shipping bill of all goods entered or required to be entered in transit, under the transit regulations now in force, from the United Kingdom to the British Possessions abroad, shall be furnished by the person or persons entering such goods to the proper officer of customs at the port or ports in the said Kingdom at which such goods may be entered for exportation in transit.

THE VILLAGE OF TOOLIOROOK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a village, under the designation prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

THE VILLAGE OF TOOLIOROOK.—Four hundred and sixty-two acres thirty-eight perches, county of Hampden, parish of Tooliorook: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 8 of section 29; thence by the south boundary of that section bearing east eighty chains; thence by the west boundaries of sections 25 and 24, bearing south fifty-seven chains seventy-eight links to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section 30; thence by that allotment, a line crossing a road, and allotment 1, bearing west eighty chains; and thence by a line bearing north fifty-seven chains seventy-eight links to the point of commencement.—(66 M. 12968.)

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF WALHALLA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to
