## DISTRICTS FOR BEER LICENSES.

#### PROCLAMATION

PROCIAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne, or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the councils of the boroughs of Malmsbury and Taradale have made application that portions of the said boroughs may be declared districts under the provise of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the portions of the boroughs of Malmsbury and Taradale hereinafter described to be respectively districts wherein Beer Licenses may be granted, that is to say:

BOROUGH OF MALMSBURY.—All that portion of the borough of Malmsbury situated east of Milvain street, and Dayy's road:

Licenses may be granted, that is to say:—

Bobough of Malmsbury.—All that portion of the borough of Malmsbury situated east of Milvain street, and Davy's road: Commencing at the north end of Milvain street, bounded on the west by Milvain street and Davy's road to the Kailway line; thence on the south-west by the Railway line; on the south-east by road leading from Lauriston to Kyneton; on the cast by River Campaspe and one-chain road to the north-east angle of the borough; and thence by the northern boundary of the borough, being a line bearing west to the commencing point.—(Q.3201.)

Borough of Theadale—All that northern of the borough
