5. That all cattle for which the commonage fees have been paid shall be pitch-branded on the near side with the brand belonging to the common.

6. That no entire horse or bull over twelve months old shall be permitted on the common, except by the permission in writing of the managers.

7. That persons depasturing cattle may at any time remove them, and substitute others; but it shall be unlawful for any person to take any other than his own stock further than the nearest yard, for the purpose of drafting.

10. The managers shall have power to employ a herdsman, if necessary; such herdsman to be paid by the shire council out of the moneys received for pasturage.

Interpretation clause.—The word "cattle" shall mean and include horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, cows., oxen, heifers, steers, calves, and shall apply to any one or more animal or animals of the said several kinds.
