**WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act* 1863, has, by Orders severally made on the 8th day of April, 1867, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils and District Board shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 8th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal twenty-two chains of the Ararat to Wickliffe Main Road.
