## CHILD MURDER AT EAST MELBOURNE.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS on the morning of Friday, the 3rd instant, the Body of a newly-born Female Child, destitute of clothing, was found at the corner of Clarendon street and Wellington parade, East Melbourne: And whereas at a coroner's inquest held thereon, the jury returned a verdict that the said child was wilfully and maliciously strangled at East Melbourne on or about the 2nd instant by some persons or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person guilty of causing the death of the said child.

## PORTS AND HARBORS OF VICTORIA.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas, by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Ports, Harbors, and Shipping in the Colony of Victoria*, did define the limits and boundaries of ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and regulations formerly in force: Now I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal the limits and boundaries of ports and general rules and regulations contained in the Proclamation above specified, and do declare that the following shall be the definitions and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and general rules and orders applicable to the same, that is to say:—

## DEFINITIONS OF LIMITS AND BOUNDARIES OF PORTS IN VICTORIA.

**Port Phillip.**—The port of Port Phillip shall consist of all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbors within a line drawn from Point Lonsdale to Point Nepean, and not included in the ports of Melbourne and Geelong respectively.

**Melbourne.**—The port of Melbourne shall consist of all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbors contained within a line drawn from the southernmost part of Gellibrand's Point to Point Ormond.

**Geelong.**—The port of Geelong shall consist of all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbors within Corio Bay, and contained within a line from Point Richards to Point Wilson.

**Portland.**—The port of Portland shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays contained within a line running due north from Point Danger to the opposite shore.

**Belfast.**—The port of Belfast shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays contained within a line running north-east from the eastern point of Rabbit Island to the opposite shore.

**Warrnambool.**—The port of Warrnambool shall consist of all bays, rivers, and inlets contained within a line running from the outer end of the reef lying off Saddle Island to the entrance of the Hopkins River.

**Western Port.**—The port of Western Port shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays contained within a line from Blackhead to Point Grant, and from Cape Woolamai to Point Griffiths.

**Corner Inlet.**—The port of Corner Inlet shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays contained within a line from Entrance Point to north end of La Trobe Island, thence due north to the main land.

**Port Albert.**—The port of Port Albert shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays, contained within a line from the easternmost part of Shallow Inlet to the south end of La Trobe Island, thence due north to the main land.

**Rivers.**—[The word "rivers" in the foregoing definitions must be understood to include all rivers and streams navigable for vessels and boats from the mouth up to the point where by reason of any natural obstruction in the bed or stream, as for instance a bar or fall, or of the shallowness of the water, they cease to be so navigable. The encircling boundary of the above-mentioned ports within the respective lines above mentioned is intended in each case to be the coast up to high-water mark, except in those parts where any navigable river runs farther inland.]

## GENERAL RULES AND ORDERS APPLICABLE TO ALL PORTS AND HARBORS IN VICTORIA.

1. **Flag for vessels from other than Australasian ports.**—The person in charge of any ship from other than Australasian ports shall, when entering any port of Victoria, hoist and keep her ensign flying at the mainmast head, until the vessel has been boarded and cleared by the health officer, when the ensign is to be hauled down and a blue flag hoisted and kept flying until the ship has been cleared by the immigration officer.

2. **Flag for vessels from Australasian ports.**—The person in charge of any ship from any Australasian port (not in Victoria) shall, when entering any port in Victoria, hoist a blue flag at the mainmast head, and keep it flying until cleared by the immigration officer.

3. **Ship entering port.**—No person, except the pilot and health and immigration officers, and boatmen employed to convey them, shall, with any vessel or boat whatever, go alongside of, nor shall any person, except the pilot and such officers, board any ship

from other than an Australasian port when entering or within any port in Victoria, before she has been cleared by the health and immigration officers, nor shall any person on board leave such vessel before she has been so cleared.

4. **Blue flag.**—No person, except the pilot and other duly authorised officers of Government, and such reporters for the press as hold a written authority from the Government, shall go on board of, or leave, any ship entering or within any port until such vessel has been cleared by the immigration officer, which clearance will be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down.

5. **Health officer.**—The health officer boards all ships arriving at any port in Victoria from any port beyond Australasia between sunrise and sunset. All such vessels arriving at Port Phillip must remain off Shortland's Bluff until cleared by the health officer.

NOTE.—Vessels merely calling at Australasian ports on their way to Victoria, and bringing passengers from other than Australasian ports, and all vessels from affected Australasian ports, or having infectious diseases on board, shall come under rules 1 and 5.

6. **Master to report to boarding officer.**—The master or person in charge of any ship entering any port in Victoria is required to furnish both the health officer and immigration officer, or immigration officer only, as the case may be (*vide* rules 1 and 2), with a written report of such particulars of his voyage, cargo, and passengers, and such information relating to the same as may be required.

7. **Blue flag.**—No boat shall make fast to, or tow alongside of, any inward bound ship under weigh within any port, except steam-tugs and those duly authorised by Government, before the ship is properly anchored and the blue flag hauled down.

8. **Heave to for boarding officer.**—The pilot, master, or person in charge of any vessel entering, departing from, or within any port, shall by every means in his power, consistent with the safety of such ship, assist every duly authorised public officer in boarding or leaving such ship, and no person on board of any such ship shall interfere with or obstruct any Government officer or pilot whilst carrying out their duties respectively.

9. **National colors.**—Every ship must, between sunrise and sunset, hoist her national colors under the following circumstances:—

- (A.) When entering any port, the colors to be kept flying until the vessel has arrived at her final destination.
- (B.) On Sundays and public holidays, weather permitting.
- (C.) On leaving port.

10. **Show number.**—The person in charge of any vessel entering or departing from any port shall, as the vessel approaches the signal station, hoist the vessel's number or distinguishing flag; and if inward bound, the number of the port the vessel is from. Such flags shall be kept flying until answered from the station.

11. **Crew on board.**—All ships plying within any port must be in charge of a competent master, and also be manned by a sufficient number of experienced seamen.

12. **Anchor buoys.**—All ships must have proper buoys and sufficient buoy-ropes to their anchors. Any anchor, kedg, cable, or mooring, shipped, parted, or cut from, if not weighed within twelve hours, may be weighed by order of the harbor-master, at the risk and expense of the owner.

13. **Firearms.**—All vessels must unshot their guns immediately after entering any port, and no guns or firearms are to be discharged by any person on board any ship or boat on the shore within any port, nor any blue-lights, rockets, or other combustibles burned unless permission in writing has been obtained from the harbor-master, except only when urgent assistance is required.

14. **Vessels moored.**—Vessels moored with two anchors are always to have both cables clear. (1) Vessels lying at single anchor are to have the second anchor clear. (2) In both cases the windlass and cables must be kept in readiness to slack away or heave in cables when required.

15. **Government boats.**—All boats alongside of ships, wharfs, or jetties, shall give way to Government boats on duty.

16. **Work on Sundays.**—No vessel, except steamers plying with passengers only, within the limits of the ports of Melbourne and Geelong, shall be unmoored on Sunday from her anchorage, or from her berth alongside any quay; and no work shall be done on any ship in harbor on Sundays except such as may be necessary for the cleanliness or safety of the ship, or for the navigation of steamers aforesaid, unless by the express permission in writing of the harbor-master.

17. **Boats, &c., astern of vessels.**—No boat or lighter shall be allowed to ride astern of any vessel at anchor within the ports of Melbourne and Geelong at a greater distance from such vessel than three fathoms, nor shall any deeply laden boat, log or logs of timber, or other floating objects likely to injure other vessels or boats, be allowed to remain astern of any vessel.

18. **Boats near wharfs.**—No lighter or boat shall anchor less distance than one hundred fathoms from any wharf or jetty except for the purpose of immediately hauling alongside.

19. **Boats at landing-places.**—No boat shall remain at any landing-place after discharging her cargo and passengers (or make fast to the steps or handrail belonging thereto), unless there be some person in charge ready to remove such boat when required to do so by the harbor-master or person deputed by him.

20. **Boiling pitch, tar, &c.**—No pitch, tar, resin, oil, or other such like combustible matter, shall be heated by fire on board any vessel or boat without the permission in writing of the harbor-master. [But this rule is not to be understood to prevent the burning

of any lamp or candle for giving light on board, or the lighting of any fire for the purpose of cooking or of working the machinery of any vessel, although such permission may not have been given.]

21. *Fires.—Smoking ships.*—Between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. (10 p.m.) and Four (4 a.m.) no fires, except the furnaces of steamers, shall be lit, or unenclosed lights allowed to burn on board any vessel in any part of a port or harbor where vessels lie for the purpose of loading and discharging cargo, or effecting repairs; nor shall any vessel be fumigated or smoked, except the vessel be moored at a sufficient distance from other vessels, and permission in writing be obtained from the harbor-master. All fires and lights allowed must be properly enclosed.

22. *Fire-buckets.*—All vessels under four hundred tons are required to be provided with fire-buckets in the proportion of four to every hundred tons, and two for every additional hundred tons above four hundred, one half of which buckets shall be constantly hung up in some convenient place, with lanyards attached ready for drawing water.

23. *Lights must be enclosed.*—No artificial light is to be used in any part of any vessel, except the same be securely enclosed and in charge of some trustworthy person.

24. *Lights out.*—After work has ceased for the day on board of any vessel, and before closing the hatches, an officer shall go into the hold and into the between decks and satisfy himself that—(1.) There are no signs of fire. (2.) That all lights have been put out, except those authorised in clause 21, and an entry thereof shall be made in the log-book.

25. *Ship on fire.*—In the event of fire occurring on board any vessel in port, all persons in charge of or otherwise belonging to any vessel or boat, are to afford such assistance towards extinguishing the fire, and the protection of neighboring vessels as the harbor-master or person deputed by him may demand.

26. *Beacons not to be made fast to.*—No person in charge of any vessel shall moor or make fast any such vessel to any buoy or beacon not being a mooring or warping buoy or beacon.

27. *Dead animals.*—No person shall throw, place, or leave any dead body within the boundary of any port, or any dead animal on the shores thereof.

28. *Death on board.*—In the event of the death of any person on board of any vessel in port, the master of such vessel is to cause the body to be buried on shore, previously reporting the particulars to the police.

29. *Watch on board, and anchor light.*—All vessels in port shall always have at least one seaman as watch on deck, with the following exceptions:—(1.) Vessels laid up, coal hulks, ballast or other lighters lying within such limits as the harbor-master authorised them to occupy, such vessel or vessels shall always have one person on board. (2.) Vessels and boats lying within the limits marked (A) are not required to keep a person constantly on board. All persons aforesaid, and all persons in charge of boats, shall answer the challenge of the water-police or other public officer. All vessels and boats at anchor within Hobson's Bay must from sunset to sunrise exhibit a bright white light so as to be seen clear above the gunwale, except ships and boats moored to the shore, or to any wharf, pier, or jetty. (A) or lying within a line drawn from the steamboat jetty at the west side of the Hobson's Bay Railway pier, to the red dolphin at the entrance to the Yarra, thence through the outer red dolphin to the west side of the steamboat jetty at Williamstown, and within the twelve feet depth line on the Sandridge side, or within the nine feet depth line on the Williamstown side of Hobson's Bay.

30. *Careening, &c.*—Masters requiring to careen, heave down, or haul their vessels or boats on shore, for the purpose of inspection or repairs, must obtain the permission of the harbor-master of the port, except where such work is proposed to be done on private property.

31. *Gangway ladder.*—Every vessel shall be provided with a good and sufficient stage or gangway ladder, for the use of persons coming from or going on board such ships.

32. *Report of accidents.*—Accidents involving personal injury, loss of life or property, from loss or collision of vessels or boats, are to be reported in writing by the person in charge of the vessel or boat concerned, to the nearest harbor-master as soon as possible.

33. *Landing passengers.*—Masters of vessels arriving from ports beyond the Australasian colonies shall not compel their steerage passengers to leave their vessels, for the purpose of landing at Melbourne or Geelong, after Two o'clock p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, nor after Three o'clock p.m. during the remaining months of the year, unless with the consent of the immigration officer.

34. *Berthing vessels.*—The harbor-master, or a person deputed by him, shall appoint the place where all vessels, lighters, and boats shall lie within any port.

35. *Removing vessels.*—It shall be competent at any time for the harbor-master or a person deputed by him, to order any vessel, lighter, boat, timber, or other article, to be removed from any berth alongside any quay or anchorage from or to any part of the harbor.

36. *General order.*—All masters, pilots, or other persons in charge of vessels, shall when called upon by the harbor-master or person deputed by him to do so, immediately strike their topgallant yards and masts, have their jib-sparker and all booms rigged close in, top up and brace fore and aft all yards, and moor with two anchors, or clear hawse, and generally follow such directions as the weather, the crowded condition of the port, or other circumstances may render necessary or expedient, in the judgment of the harbor-master, with a view to the safety and interest of the whole shipping.

37. *Compulsory removal of vessels.*—In the event of any hostile attack or other emergency necessitating, in the harbor-master's opinion, the immediate removal of any vessel from one part of any harbor to another, the harbor-master is empowered to order such vessel to be removed at once, and should the owner, master, or person in charge not immediately on being called upon take the most prompt measures to carry the harbor-master's order into effect, the harbor-master is authorised to hire such steam-tugs and men, tackle, or ballast as may be required to effect such removal; and no such vessel shall be cleared out at the custom-house until the expense so incurred in such removal has been paid, due notice thereof having been given to the collector of customs, and no responsibility shall attach to the harbor-master for any damage that may be occasioned by his acts done in such emergency in accordance with this rule.

38. *Obstructions to be removed.*—If any obstruction whatever be found to interfere or likely to interfere with the free and safe navigation of any port, it shall be competent for the harbor-master to remove it or require the person who was owner of such obstruction at the time it arose, or who may have become the owner, to remove it; and such owner shall exhibit on or near such obstruction such flags, masts, or lights as the harbor-master may direct until it is removed to his satisfaction.

#### FAIRWAYS, CHANNELS, AND RIVERS.

39. *No vessel to lie in fairways.*—No vessel, lighter, boat, or raft, shall be anchored in the middle of any fairway, channel or river; but when detained there, they shall lie close over on either side of such fairway, channel, or river; nor shall any cable, chain, hawser, or rope, be placed across any such fairway, channel or river, without permission from the harbor-master.

40. *Hobson's Bay anchorage.*—A pilot in charge of any vessel (not coming within the gunpowder anchorage regulations) bound to Hobson's Bay, shall ascertain from the master whether such vessel is to discharge her cargo at the Sandridge or Williamstown pier, and moor her accordingly; but should there be no vacant berth, or should the vessel not be going alongside either pier, he is to moor such vessel with two anchors in a clear berth within the inner anchorage as close over to the Sandridge or Williamstown side as her draught of water will permit.

41. *Masters of vessels exempt from pilotage* are to comply with Clause 40, so far as relates to the anchorage within Hobson's Bay.

42. *Fairway to be kept clear.*—Any vessel compelled by unavoidable circumstances to let go an anchor in the middle of any fairway, channel, or river, shall, as soon as possible, lift the same, and place it in such a situation as not to interrupt or interfere with the free passage of other vessels.

43. *Rafts, &c.*—No raft of timber shall be taken up the Yarra without a written order from the harbor-master.

44. *Berth alongside wharfs.*—No vessel shall go alongside any wharf or jetty without the authority of the harbor or pier master.

45. *Geelong channel.*—No sailing vessel shall enter the new channel leading into Geelong whilst any other vessel is passing through it from the opposite direction.

46. *Ships to be berthed in rotation.*—All vessels, on application being made to the harbor or pier master, will be provided with vacant berths in rotation, according to their time of arrival in the port. Any vessel on being appointed to a discharging berth must immediately proceed to occupy it, otherwise the berth will be given to the vessel next in turn.

47. *Hatches to be on.*—All vessels, when not engaged in loading or unloading, shall uniformly have their hatchways and coal scuttles securely closed.

48. *Stray boats, &c., to be handed to water police.*—All stray boats, timber, or other articles found within any port, must be immediately delivered up to the water police, in whose custody they shall remain until claimed by the proper owner, who must pay all reasonable expenses thereon.

#### PUBLIC WHARFS AND JETTIES.

49. *Time allowed ships at wharfs.*—The time allowed vessels with full cargoes on board to occupy berths at public quays, for the purpose of discharging cargo, shall be (exclusive of Sundays and holidays) as follows:—

For ships under 100 tons ...	...	...	...	2 days

and so on at the rate of one (1) day for every additional hundred tons register. Vessels not having full cargoes on board shall be allowed time in proportion.

50. *Taking in cargo.*—Vessels taking in cargo shall remove to any berth pointed out for that purpose by the harbor or pier master.

51. *Discharging.*—Vessels discharging cargo shall have prior claim to the wharf to vessels taking in.

The cargo of any vessel loading or discharging at any wharf shall not occupy a greater space on any such wharf than the length of such vessel, except by special permission of the harbor-master.

52. *Outside berth.*—Vessels discharging or taking in cargo at outside berths shall be allowed two days for one of the foregoing scale.

53. Cargo may be discharged from or taken in by any ship lying outside, over and across the deck of any vessel lying alongside of any quay.

54. *Placing goods on jetty.*—All goods landed on any wharf or jetty shall be so placed as to keep the mooring posts or rings free, and allow a clear passage of at least five feet from the edge of the wharf nearest the vessel, upon which space no goods shall be allowed to remain.

55. *Wharfs to be cleared.*—No vessel shall be removed from the wharf until the portion of it opposite to or required for the use of such vessel has been thoroughly cleared of all rubbish, and swept clean by a person belonging to her, or hired by the master or owner of such vessel, to the satisfaction of the harbor or pier master.

56. *Removing goods from wharfs.*—In the event of any goods which may be landed or placed for shipment on any of the public wharfs being allowed to remain on such wharf more than twenty-four hours, notice will be served on the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods, and if the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods cannot be ascertained or found, a notice will be posted upon or affixed to some conspicuous part of such goods; and if they are not removed within three days from the date of such notice, the goods will be taken by the officer discharging the duties of wharfinger to the Customs Reserve, or some other place duly appointed for that purpose, and there dealt with according to the 43rd section of *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865*.

57. *Goods outwards.*—No goods shall be placed on any of the public wharfs for shipment until the vessel for which the goods have been entered outwards has been berthed at the wharf.

58. No person shall carry on any retail trade in timber or other goods on the wharfs or wharf land.

59. *Improper use of wharfs.*—No sorting, bulking, or repacking of timber or other goods, nor screening of coals, will be permitted on any portion of the wharf, and no coals shall be placed on any wharf except in bags, nor shall any goods be put on any wharf which, in the opinion of the harbor-master, are likely to occasion damage to such wharf, nor shall any goods be placed on any wharf so as to be an impediment to the wharf approaches or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from the wharf.

60. *Drays, &c.*—No carriage, cab, dray, or other vehicle, nor any horse shall ply on any pier or jetty without the permission of the harbor or pier master.

61. *Ship at owner's risk.*—The Government take no charge of vessels or boats while lying within any port; their security and safety, whether at an anchor or moored alongside any pier or jetty, is at the risk of the owners.

62. *Rubbish.*—No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse shall be thrown from any boat, ship, or vehicle, by any person into any port, river, or anchorage, or be landed, or shipped in any port, except at the places pointed out by the harbor-master; and all such ballast, gravel, rubbish, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse shall be removed as and where such harbor-master may direct.

63. *Steam hoisting machinery.*—The master of any vessel within the meaning of *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865*, or any person under his command, shall not permit any steam machinery to be used on any public wharf for hoisting cargo into or out of such ship, or for any other purpose in connection with such ship, unless the owner of such steam machinery shall be the holder of an uncancelled certificate from the Chief Harbor-master that such machinery is in good order, and that the person in charge thereof is duly qualified; and such master or other person shall, while such machinery is being so used, keep possession of such certificate, and shall produce it on demand to the harbor or pier master in charge of the wharf, pier, or jetty. Such certificates will be issued by the Chief Harbor-master subject to the following conditions:—

1st. All steam hoisting-engines, and the persons in charge thereof, shall be examined by the engineer surveyor to the Steam Navigation Board, and passed by him.

2nd. These engines to be examined once every six months.

3rd. A fee of 30s. shall be paid for each survey of an engine, and a fee of 20s. for each person so examined and passed.

#### BALLAST.

64. *Ballast.*—Masters of vessels shall not raise sand or other material from below high-water mark for ballasting vessels except with the permission in writing of, and at places appointed by, the harbor-master.

65. *Tarpaulins to be used.*—Proper tarpaulins or sheets shall be used in discharging or taking in ballast, coals, rubbish, gravel, earth or filth, so as to effectually prevent any part thereof falling overboard; and no ballast shall be taken on board or discharged from any vessel after dark without special permission of the harbor-master.

66. *Ballast lighters.*—The names of all ballast lighters and of the masters and owners thereof shall be registered in the harbor office, and the register shall be kept open for the inspection of any person desiring to inspect the same. All vessels, lighters, or boats employed in carrying ballast shall have the number of their certificate painted on both bows, and shall have a mark cut upon the stem and sternpost showing the draught of water for every five tons weight they carry, such marks and corresponding draughts of water shall be endorsed upon their certificate, which shall be produced when asked for by

NOTE.—*Lighter to be examined.*—To prevent disputes about the weight, masters of vessels are recommended, before receiving their ballast, to compare the marks on the ballast lighters with

the certificate, and satisfy themselves that the lighter has nothing on board but ballast, and that the whole has been delivered.

67. Ballast lighters shall be trimmed on an even keel.

68. *Complaints to be made to harbor-master.*—Masters of vessels having any complaint are to report the same to the harbor-master.

69. All commanders of vessels shall have power to inspect ballast lighters before ballast be unladen.

70. Masters or persons in charge of ballast lighters shall, before commencing to discharge their ballast, pump the vessel out dry.

71. *Lighters to be inspected.*—The Chief Harbor-master, or any person acting under his orders, may inspect or remeasure any ballast lighters, or test the accuracy of such measurement, and appoint the place and method where and how such measurement shall be made.

72. The expense of measuring and marking ballast lighters shall be borne and paid by the owner or owners of such ballast lighters.

#### GUNPOWDER.

73. *Gunpowder flag.*—Vessels and boats must not approach any licensed powder-hulk nearer than 200 yards, unless duly authorised; and every person in charge of a vessel or boat shall observe due caution when approaching any vessel having the gunpowder flag hoisted.

74. *No fire allowed.*—No fire or light is to be burning on board any vessel or boat during the time gunpowder is being discharged from or taken on Board of such vessel or boat.

75. *Stores.*—All gunpowder and other explosive materials retained on board any vessel as stores must, during the time such vessel is within the precincts of any port, be securely kept in a suitable copper magazine.

The following extracts from *The Gunpowder Statute of 1864* are published for general information:—

Sec. 4. *Vessels having more than twenty pounds of gunpowder to anchor within prescribed limits until gunpowder landed.*—The Governor in Council may prescribe the limits within which no ship or vessel having more than twenty pounds of gunpowder on board arriving in or off any of the ports or harbors of Victoria shall be permitted to anchor, and if the master of any such ship or vessel shall anchor within the limits so prescribed before all such gunpowder shall have been landed, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for every barrel or package of gunpowder which shall not have been so landed previously to anchoring within such limits.

Sec. 6. *Master of vessel to report having gunpowder on board.*—The master of every ship arriving in any port of Victoria with gunpowder on board, whether as stores or cargo, shall at the time of making entry at the custom-house specially report the same; and if any gunpowder be not so reported it shall be forfeited, and the master neglecting to make such report shall forfeit and pay a penalty for such omission or neglect any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds.

Sec. 7. *Gunpowder not to be landed except between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.*—No gunpowder shall be landed from any ship except between the hours of seven in the morning and five in the afternoon, and any person who shall land, or be concerned in landing, any gunpowder contrary hereto shall forfeit and pay the sum of Five pounds for every barrel or package of such gunpowder so landed contrary to this provision.

Sec. 8. *Vessels with gunpowder to hoist flag.*—Every ship or vessel having gunpowder on board exceeding twenty pounds in all, shall immediately on entering any port of Victoria hoist a union jack at the mainmast head, which union jack shall not be hauled down until the gunpowder on board be landed according to law.

Sec. 9. *Importers to enter gunpowder and get permit to land and store it.*—The importer of gunpowder at any port where a public magazine shall have been appointed or a private magazine shall have been licensed, shall within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the importing ship enter such gunpowder at the custom-house, and shall obtain from the collector or other principal officer a permit for the same to be landed and deposited in one of such magazines, which permit shall describe the said gunpowder and name the magazine in which it is to be deposited.

Sec. 10. *Boats only specially licensed to convey gunpowder.*—No boat shall be used for the conveyance of gunpowder either to or from any ship or wharf or other place unless duly licensed for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Act now in force or some Act hereafter to be in force relating to the customs; and no gunpowder shall be landed or conveyed from any ship until notice shall have been given to the water police, if any there be at the port or place where such ship shall lie, in sufficient time to enable the police to give such directions as may be necessary to prevent danger, which directions the officer or person in charge of such gunpowder shall in all things obey.

Sec. 11. *Gunpowder not to be removed from vessel to magazine except between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.*—No gunpowder shall be removed from any vessel for conveyance to the magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon, or shall be permitted to be deposited in the magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon.

Sec. 17. *Coasting steamers not to carry gunpowder.*—No steam vessel arriving in, or departing from, or employed within, or on the coast of Victoria shall carry gunpowder, either as stores or cargo, except such reasonable quantity as may be required for the purpose of making signals.

Sec. 19. *Vessels receiving gunpowder to be anchored in certain limits.*—No gunpowder shall be put on board any ship unless she be anchored beyond the limits within which importing ships having gunpowder on board are not permitted to anchor, nor except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon.

Sec. 21. *Penalty on offences against this Act not otherwise provided for.*—If any gunpowder shall be kept, landed, carried, or shipped contrary to this Act, it shall be forfeited, or if any person shall violate any of the provisions of this Act with respect to which no penalty (or the confiscation of gunpowder only) is specified he shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding one hundred pounds.

#### MAILS.

76. *Mail flags.*—All vessels having mails on board for Melbourne or any other port of the colony except Geelong shall, on approaching the anchorage, hoist a white flag at the foremast head, which flag must be kept up until the mails are taken out of the vessel.

77. *Mails for Geelong.*—All vessels having mails on board for Geelong shall, on entering between the heads of Port Phillip, hoist a white flag at the foremast head, as a signal for the mail boat to come off, and shall heave to or anchor within a reasonable distance of Shortland's Bluff, until such mails are taken out of the vessel.

78. *Mail boats.*—All mail boats shall have a preference of berth, whether alongside vessels or wharfs, during such time as they are occupied in shipping or landing mails.

#### PILOTS.

79. No unqualified person shall assume or continue in charge of a vessel after a licensed pilot has offered to take charge of her; and no person shall use a license which he is not entitled to use for the purpose of making himself appear to be a qualified pilot.

80. *Tugs under pilot's orders.*—All steamers or boats employed to tow, or in any way move or assist, any vessel in charge of a licensed pilot, shall be (whilst employed on such service) under the orders of such pilot in all matters connected with the navigation of such vessel.

81. The master of every vessel not by law exempt from the necessity of employing the service of a pilot shall place her in charge of the first licensed pilot that may come alongside.

82. *Flag.*—The master of any vessel about to enter any port (unless there be a qualified pilot on board, or such ship is exempted from pilotage by law) shall, when within five leagues of the entrance, or until a licensed pilot has come on board, display and keep flying the usual signal for a pilot; and such master shall, by every means in his power consistent with the safety of his ship, facilitate such pilot getting on board.

83. The master of every vessel which by law is exempt from payment of pilotage shall, on arriving within four leagues of any port or harbor, cause a white flag to be hoisted (below the blue flag mentioned in clause 1) at the mainmast head, and keep it flying until the vessel is anchored within the port.

84. No inward-bound vessel shall exhibit a white flag at the mainmast head unless the master of such vessel holds an exemption certificate from the Pilot Board.

85. Pilots shall, while on board any vessel, see that the Port and Harbor Regulations of the colony are strictly complied with by the master or other person in charge of such vessel; and pilots will be held responsible for any neglect or breach of such regulations during the time they are on board of any vessel.

86. Certificates of pilotage shall be filled up and signed by the master or person in charge of each vessel piloted, and delivered to the pilot.

87. *Pilot wanted.*—The master of any ship in port requiring a pilot must make an application in writing, twelve (12) hours previously, at the pilot office of the port.

#### REGULATIONS FOR STEAMBOATS, AND FOR VESSELS MEETING AND PASSING.

88. *Steamer's furnace.*—The masters of steam vessels shall, as soon as their vessels are berthed, cause the furnaces and dampers to be so regulated as to prevent the possibility of accidents by fire, and shall so adjust their furnace doors and temper their furnace fires as that no more than the smallest practicable quantity of smoke shall pass therefrom.

89. When steamers have vessels in tow, and are steering opposite courses, the steamer towing a vessel bound inwards before meeting the steamer with a vessel in tow bound outwards shall slack her speed, when practicable, until the other has passed her.

90. *Steamers to go slow.*—Steamers about to pass any dredging machine at work in any river or channel, or any licensed ferry, or public work in progress, must slow their engines to less than half speed for at least one hundred yards before arriving abreast of the dredge, ferry, or work.

91. *Dredge.*—All vessels must pass the dredges on the side indicated by a red ball being displayed by day and a red light by night; when the ball is down they may pass on either side without slackening their speed.

92. Steamers must proceed at moderate speed whilst navigating amongst the shipping in any port.

93. *Man on look-out.*—Every steamer at all times when under weigh within any port must have a competent person on the bridge in charge of the vessel in addition to the helmsman, and

also a competent person in charge of and attending to the engine. The utmost care must be taken by the person or persons in charge to prevent accidents to other vessels and boats.

94. No steamer shall tow vessels between the upper and lower legal wharfs at Melbourne, nor tow two vessels abreast of each other, without the sanction of the harbormaster.

#### PENAL HULKS.

95. No vessel or boat shall pass between the hulks and the line of buoys moored round those vessels. All persons in charge of boats or vessels passing near said hulks are to answer the sentries' challenge.

#### MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.

96. *White flag.*—All vessels outward bound requiring their clearances are to hoist a white flag at the mainmast head when the ship is ready for sea.

97. *Clearance.*—After the clearance has been delivered to the master, no passenger shall be taken on board any ship outward bound.

98. A copy of these regulations shall be delivered to the master of every ship or vessel required to take a pilot on her entering any port by the pilot, who must take a receipt for the same.

99. *Every ship to have a copy of regulations.*—The master of every ship not required to take a pilot shall have a copy of these regulations delivered to him by the boarding officer; provided that it shall not be necessary in any case to issue a second copy of the regulations to the master, unless proof be given that the regulations previously issued have been lost. Every master or other officer of a ship or vessel to whom a copy of these regulations shall have been delivered shall give, on demand, an acknowledgment in writing to the officer delivering the same.

100. *Complaints to be made to harbormaster.*—All complaints against any person connected with the harbor department must be made in writing to the Chief Harbormaster.

101. The expression "Australasian" shall apply to ports in New Zealand and Tasmania as well as in Australia proper; the expression "immigration officer" shall include any immigration or emigration agent or officer, or any assistant immigration or emigration agent or officer; and the expression "harbormaster" shall include any other officer duly appointed to carry out these regulations.

102. Extract from *Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute No. 255 of 1865*:—

51. *Penalty on masters and others for non-observance of port rules.*—If the master of any ship, or any person under his command or on board such ship, or if any pilot or other person shall fail or neglect to observe all or any of the rules or regulations to be framed as aforesaid, or shall do or commit anything contrary to the true intent or plain meaning thereof, such master for every such offence committed, either by himself or such person under his command or on board such ship, and such pilot or other person for any such offence committed by himself, shall forfeit and pay a sum not less than five pounds and not exceeding one hundred pounds.

#### THE FOLLOWING SIGNALS ARE IN USE WITHIN THE PORTS OF VICTORIA.

<i>Harbor pilot</i> ... ..	The ensign at the foremast head.
<i>Health officer</i> ... ..	The ensign at mainmast head.
<i>Quarantine</i> ... ..	Yellow flag at the mainmast head.
<i>Sea pilot</i> ... ..	The union jack at the foremast head.
<i>Water police</i> ... ..	Day signal:—The ensign at the mainmast head. Night signal:—Two lights vertical at any mast head or the peak, having five feet between the two.
<i>Customs boat</i> ... ..	Union jack at the peak.
<i>Steamboats</i> ... ..	Rendezvous flag at the peak or mizenmast.
<i>Gunpowder on board</i> ... ..	Union jack at the main.
<i>Medical assistance</i> ... ..	No. 5 at the peak.
<i>Boarding officer</i> ... ..	Blue flag at the main.
<i>Mails on board</i> ... ..	White flag at the fore to be kept flying till the mails are out of the ship.
