THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE BACCHUS MARSH AND MADDINGLEY ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day
of May, 1867.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in and for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixth day of October, 1862, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Bacchus Marsh and Maddingley Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August, 1863, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Bacchus Marsh and Maddingley Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

BACCHUS MARSH SUBDIVISION.—Starting on the Werribee River at the eastern boundary of the parish of Parwan; thence by the Werribee River and Korkuperrinul Creek and by the boundaries of portions 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, and 54, section VII., parish of Blackwood, and excluding those portions, to the boundary of the district; thence by that boundary northerly, easterly, and southerly to the starting point.

PENTLAND HILLS SUBDIVISION.—Starting at the junction of Korkuperrinul Creek and Werribee River; thence up that river and by the boundaries of the district, and of the Bacchus Marsh subdivision, by the said creek to the starting point.

PARWAN SUBDIVISION.—Starting on the Werribee River at the eastern boundary of the parish of Parwan; thence by the boundaries of the district, and of Pentland Hills and Bacchus Marsh, and excluding those subdivisions, to the starting point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

FELLING OF OAK TREES IN THE PARISH OF PINGAL PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove Oak Trees from the portions of Crown land hereinafter named and described, that is to say:—County of Mornington, parish of Pingal, being allotments 9 and 12 of section C, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter respectively described, viz.:—Allotment 9: Commencing at the north-west angle of the allotment; thence by allotment 8 bearing easterly thirty-six chains seventy-five links; thence by a road bearing S. 1° 10' W. forty chains; thence by a road bearing N. 89° 4' W. thirty-six chains seventy-five links; and thence by a road bearing N. 1° E. forty chains to the point of commencement.—Allotment 12: Commencing at the north-west angle of the allotment; thence by a road bearing S. 89° 4' E. thirty-six chains sixty-four links and S. 88° 50' E. fourteen chains thirty links; thence by allotment 13 bearing S. 1° 10' W. thirty-nine chains; thence by allotment 21 bearing N. 88° 50' W. fifty chains eighty-two links; and thence by a road bearing N. 1° E. thirty-eight chains eighty-six links to the point of commencement.—(67, P.5233.)

COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act*

1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

BURGOYNE AND TARRAWARRA FARMERS' COMMON.—The portion of the Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of February, 1867, whereby the Burgoyne and Tarrawarra Farmers' Common was increased by the addition thereto of certain land described in such Proclamation, is hereby revoked, and the said common is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined, and containing 5,200 acres, more or less (in lieu of the land added thereto by the aforesaid Proclamation), viz.: Commencing on the right bank of the River Yarra, at the point where the west boundary of the land licensed to Mary Ann McPherson under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* abuts thereon; thence by the west and north boundaries of that land bearing respectively north four chains, and east seventeen chains to the aforesaid river; thence by that river bearing northerly to the south boundary of the land licensed to Edward Evans under the aforesaid section and Act; thence by the said boundary of that land bearing west nine chains fifty links; thence by the west boundary thereof and a line, bearing north forty-six chains to the south boundary of allotment D in the parish of Burgoyne; thence by the said boundary of that allotment bearing west nineteen chains, more or less, to the south-west angle thereof; thence by the western boundaries of allotments D and 3, bearing north-easterly to the southern side of the old road from Eltham to Burgoyne; thence crossing that road to its northern side; thence by the said side of that road bearing north-easterly to the junction of the road forming the western boundary of allotment 7, therewith; thence by that road bearing northerly four miles and a half, more or less, to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the land licensed William Jewson under the section and Act aforesaid; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and thirteen chains; thence by a line bearing south four miles fifty-four chains, more or less, to the southern side of the aforesaid road from Eltham to Burgoyne; thence by that road bearing westerly to a point bearing north from the summit of Mount Graham; thence by a line bearing south to the summit of the said mount; and thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.O.3961.)
