PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Horsham, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of November, 1863, and increased by two several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 6th day of November, 1865, and the 22nd day of October, 1866, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the township of Horsham, containing an area of two hundred (200) acres, more or less.—(57 P. 5946.)

KIORA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Kiora Temporary Common, described in two Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 22nd day of January, 1866, and the 21st day of December, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotment 61, in the parish of Kiora, containing an area of 600 acres and 12 perches.—(67 P. 5799.)

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated from a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of April, 1867:—

The rate of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs was stated in the March report to be on the decline. This decline was maintained in April, the average throughout that month being 13.10 deaths per day, against 14.16 in March. The deaths, however, numbered more than in any previous month of April, except that of 1865, and exceeded by 62 the mean for that month in 8 years.

The month was slightly colder than the average. The atmospheric pressure exceeded the average by a small fraction.

Deaths of males and females were in the proportions of 54 per cent. and 46 per cent. respectively. Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age, against 54 per cent. in April, 1866, 60 per cent. in April, 1865, 62 per cent. in April, 1864, 58 per cent. in April, 1863, 53 per cent. in April, 1862, 58 per cent. in April, 1861, and 61 per cent. in April, 1860.

Twenty-two deaths occurred on the 19th, 21 on the 20th, 19 on the 4th, and 18 on the 18th of the month. These were the days of highest mortality: those of the lowest were the 12th and 30th, on each of which only 7 deaths took place.

A female aged 79 died during the month of apoplexy; and a female aged 80 of disease of the brain. These were the only persons whose deaths were reported at more advanced ages than 75 years.

Thirteen violent deaths are recorded for the month, all of which are believed to have resulted from accident. The following are the particulars:—A male aged 36 died of a fractured skull, resulting from an accidental fall when drunk; a carter aged 53 of the effects of a fall from a dray; a female child aged 11 months, and another aged 2½ years of scalds; an agent aged 35 of a snake-bite; a boy aged 3 of drowning in a water-hole; a boy aged 7 of drowning in the Yarra; a seaman aged 26 of drowning in Hobson's Bay whilst drunk; a seaman aged 33 of drowning in the Yarra whilst drunk; a shipmaster aged 36 of drowning at Williamstown whilst in a state of delirium tremens; 3 infants, aged respectively 6 weeks, 7 weeks, and 4 months, of suffocation in bed.

Sixty-one deaths, or 15½ per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 42 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the hulk *Success*.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different districts since the census was taken.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 221, of which 115, or about 52 per cent., were of males, and 106, or nearly 48 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 111 were under one year of age, 54 were between one and two years, 23 were between two and three, 21 were between three and four, and 12 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 172, of which 97, or about 56 per cent., were males, and 75, or nearly 44 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 2 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 14 were between fifty and fifty-five, 6 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 1 was between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, 1 was eighty and upwards, and one was of age unspecified.

Zymotic diseases caused 38 per cent. of the mortality during the month under review against 43 per cent. in March, and a still higher proportion in February and January. Of this class of disorders, measles, in the month under review, caused only 9 deaths against 32 in March, and dysentery and diarrhoea caused 52 deaths against 81 in March. Scarlatina and diphtheria, on the other hand, caused 43 deaths against 31 in March. Under the head "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis caused 41 deaths against 38 deaths in March.
