PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or diminish (as the case may be), the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

INGLEWOOD BOROUGH COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands, comprising an area of 7,800 acres, more or less, within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and constitute a Common for all householders of the borough of Inglewood, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Inglewood Gold-field Common, as described in a Proclamation dated 25th January, 1861, the said angle being a point on the Loddon River; thence by a line bearing west five miles and a half, more or less, to the road from Kingswood to Inglewood, the said line being part of the south boundary of the said Gold Field Common; thence by the said road bearing north-easterly one mile and three-quarters, more or less, to the west boundary of the borough of Inglewood; thence by the said boundary of that borough bearing north one mile fifty-two chains, more or less, to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the north boundary thereof and a line bearing east four miles thirty chains, more or less, to Bulabul Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to its junction with the aforesaid river; and thence by that river bearing southerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.6954.)

INGLEWOOD GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Inglewood Gold-field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January, 1861, and diminished by a Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of July, 1863, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Common, the said angle being a point on the River Loddon; thence by the south boundary of the Common bearing west five miles and a half, more or less, to the road from Kingswood to Inglewood; thence by that road bearing north-easterly one mile and three-quarters, more or less, to the west boundary of the borough of Inglewood; thence by the said boundary of that borough bearing north one mile fifty-two chains, more or less, to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the north boundary thereof and a line bearing east four miles thirty chains, more or less, to Bulabul Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to its junction with the aforesaid river; and thence by that river bearing southerly to the point of commencement. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or abolish (as the case may be) the commons

hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

GLENGRANT FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Glengrant, described in two separate Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 11th day of December, 1865, and the 31st day of December, 1866, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and the portions of land, the boundaries of which are hereinafter described, shall be and constitute a Farmers' Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the said agricultural area, viz.: Parish of Shelbourne, section 4, excepting allotment 1b; sections 5 and 6; section 7, allotments 1, 5, and 6a; the water reserves in section 11; section 12, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4b, 7, and 8; sections 13 and 14; section 15, allotment 1; section 16, allotments 3, 4, 5, and 6; section 17, allotments 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7; section 18, allotments 1, 4, 5, and 6b; section 19, allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4b; section 20; section 21, allotment 2b; section 22, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7b; sections 23, 24, and 25; the land bounded on the north by the south boundaries of sections 4, 5, 6, and 7, parish of Shelbourne; on the west by the road forming the east boundary of the parish of Woodstock; on the south by the north boundaries of sections 11, 16, 17, and 22; and on the east by the road bearing N. 14° 14' E. to the south-east angle of section 4 aforesaid.

The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of section 4, parish of Shelbourne; thence by the north boundaries of sections 4 and 5, bearing west one hundred and eighty nine chains sixty-nine links to the north-east angle of section 6; thence by a line bearing north one hundred and sixty-eight chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of the Marong Farmers' Common; thence by the south boundary of that common bearing east to the road forming western boundary of section 9, parish of Shelbourne; and thence by that road bearing southerly to the point of commencement. THE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON OF LOADER DOWNS AND LAANECOOBIE.—The Laanecoobie Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 30th day of December, 1861, and the United Farmers' Common of Loader Downs, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of December, 1866, are hereby united; and the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned neighboring Commons.—(67.O.6506.)
