## PASSPORTS FOR FOREIGN TRAVEL FOR FOREIGNERS NATURALIZED IN VICTORIA.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch of 5th June, 1866, together with its accompanying enclosures (which have been already published in the *Gazette* of 24th August, 1866, pages 1821-2), to be re-published, and the Despatch of 25th April, 1867, to be now published, for general information.

SIR.—Her Majesty's Government have had under their consideration certain applications that foreigners naturalized in one or other of Her Majesty's colonies may be enabled, like foreigners naturalized in this country, to obtain British Passports for Foreign Travel, with their attendant advantages.

A circular which Lord Clarendon has addressed to Her Majesty's Ministers and Consular Officers abroad, and of which I enclose a copy, will show you the extent to which passports granted under the authority to be conferred upon you by his despatch will be available for the holders in countries beyond Her Majesty's dominions.

I have now to authorize you to issue passports to persons naturalized as British subjects in the colony under your government. In exercising this authority care must be taken that every passport is signed by the Officer administering the Government, that it contains an express declaration that the person receiving it is naturalized as a British subject in the colony under your government, and that it states the period for which it is available, which must not exceed twelve months from the date of issue. A memorandum on a separate paper should be given with each passport, stating that it may be exchanged in London for a Foreign Office passport on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, but that it will not be renewed by any of Her Majesty's missions or consulates abroad, but only at the Foreign Office in London, except under the special circumstances stated in the Foreign Office Circular, when it may be exchanged, once for all, at any of those missions or consulates for a passport strictly limited to such a length of time as will enable the bearer to reach England or any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, and that the passport will not confer on the bearer any claim to British protection in the country of his birth.

### MEMORANDUM.

The passport accompanying this memorandum may, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, be exchanged in London for a Foreign Office passport, available for the unexpired portion of the period for which it was originally granted.

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It can be renewed only at the Foreign Office in London, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, but it may be exchanged, if run out, at any of Her Majesty's missions or consulates in foreign countries, for a passport strictly limited to such length of time as will enable the bearer to reach England or any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad. Such limited renewal may be effected once, and once only, by a British minister or consul in foreign parts. The passport confers on the bearer no claim to British protection in the country of his birth.

I have to acquaint you that I have arranged with the Secretary of State for the Colonial Department, that I should send instructions to Her Majesty's Ministers and Consuls abroad, directing them to extend to persons naturalized in British colonies, and holders of passports either from the Colonial Governors or from the Foreign Office, bearing on the face of them the place of naturalization and the period for which the passports are good, the same protection during that period as they are now in the habit of extending to persons holding passports in which they are described as "Naturalized British subjects."

I have to instruct you to act in conformity with this arrangement.

You will understand that passports granted to persons naturalized in the colonies, like passports granted to naturalized British subjects generally, cannot, as a general rule, be renewed by any of Her Majesty's ministers or consuls abroad; but in order to relieve any such persons from inconvenience in case they should have remained abroad beyond the time specified in their passports, you are authorized, in any such cases, to give such parties, in exchange for their original passports, passports strictly limited to the time required for a direct journey back to the United Kingdom, or to any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, but no second passport of the same kind must be given, without the case being submitted to this office, to a person who shall appear to have prolonged his stay beyond that limit.

SIR.—With reference to the circular despatch from this department dated the 5th of June, 1866, relative to the case of foreigners naturalized in any of Her Majesty's colonies who wish to obtain British passports for foreign travel, I have the honor to inform you that different cases have occurred lately in which such naturalized foreigners have applied in this country for passports without being in possession either of a passport from the Governor or of any official document from the colony to establish their identity and character. You will readily perceive that this is calculated to embarrass this department, and also to cause much private inconvenience to the persons concerned if they should find themselves unable to produce any sufficient evidence of their quality.

I have therefore to suggest that, in every colony containing naturalized foreigners who are likely to travel in Europe, it would be convenient that notice should from time to time be given in public newspapers of the necessity for such persons providing themselves, before leaving the colony, with some official evidence of their identity and description.

## AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

*Light on Point Lonsdale, Port Phillip.*

THE Department of Trade and Customs, at Melbourne, has given Notice that the temporary *fixed red and green* light on Point Lonsdale, was to be discontinued after the 25th day of February, 1867, and that a light of the same character, but of greater power and more extended range, was to be exhibited from the lighthouse near Point Lonsdale Telegraph Station.

From seaward the light will appear *green* between the bearings of about N. by W. and N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.; and *red* between N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and W. by S.; in clear weather the light should be seen from a distance of ten miles.

By referring to the chart it will be seen that the N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. line passes near the Lonsdale and Lightning rocks, and navigators are therefore cautioned to be on their guard before the colors begin to change, as the blending of the red and green lights will indicate close vicinity to the line which passes from the lighthouse over these dangers.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation  $8^{\circ} 20'$  E. in 1867.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reclaimed, and may from time to time re proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

DUNKELD TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Dunkeld, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 22nd day of September, 1862, the 12th day of February, 1866, and the 23rd day of October, 1866, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the unappropriated Crown Lands within the town of Dunkeld, comprising an area of 560 acres, more or less, together with the portions of land, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter described, and the allotments of land

hereinafter enumerated, shall be and constitute a Town Common for the use of all householders of the said town, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 22 in the parish of Dunkeld, the said angle being a point on the Wannan River; thence by a line bearing north 105 chains; thence by a line bearing east 113 chains, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement. Area 1000 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Commencing at a point on the Wannan River, the said point bearing west from the north-west angle of the town of Dunkeld; thence by a line bearing east 22 chains 30 links, more or less, to the said angle of that town; thence by a line forming the west boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 16, bearing north 61 chains 50 links, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river bearing westerly and southerly to the point of commencement. Area 83 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

SIR,—I transmit to you, at the request of the Civil Service Commissioners, the enclosed Regulations for an Examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, which is to take place in the months of March and April, 1868.

REGULATIONS.

For the open competition of 1868.\*

1. On Tuesday, 31st March, 1868, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. Not less than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal, [ ] for the Upper Provinces, and [ ] for the Lower Provinces, [ ] for that of Madras, and [ ] for that of Bombay.† —Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st of February, 1868, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st March, 1868, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.‡

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:§—

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a *competent knowledge* of that subject||

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *vidæ voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice

9. Selected candidates before proceeding to India will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically with the view of testing their progress in the following subjects\*:-

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *vidæ voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The marks obtained at each of such periodical examinations will be added to those previously or subsequently obtained. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "final examination." By the merit then shown it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

11. The selected candidates who at the final examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in regulation 9, shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India.

12. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

13. No person will, even after passing the final examination be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for the Civil Service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character. The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

15th April, 1867.

NOTE.—(1.) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorized the Civil Service Commissioners to state that it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 for the first year of probation, and £200 for the second year to each selected candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

(2.) All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office, for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. If a candidate is under age a surety is required.

(3.) After passing the final examination each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants and giving a bond for £1000, jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on these documents amount to £3 10s.

(4.) Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1870 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

\* Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.
