## MANAGER OF COMMON TOLL-ROADS.

THE Governor in Council, on the 20th of December, 1867, made the following appointment and arrangement with reference to Common-toll Roads, under the provisions of the Act 27 Victoria, No. 176, § 255, 256, viz. :—

### EDWARD CLARK

to be (*vice* James Eville, whose term of office has expired) Manager of the Sandridge roads, *via* Prince's Bridge and *via* Falls Bridge, proclaimed Common-toll roads under Orders in Council of 28th December, 1863, and 11th April and 30th May 1864; and that he shall, upon the 27th day of each month, receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon the roads so proclaimed, and upon the bridges thereon, all monies collected by them as and for such tolls, or due by them as the rents thereof; and that he shall within four days after the receipt thereof distribute the amount so collected amongst the local bodies interested therein, in the proportions directed by Order in Council of 15th August, 1864; such appointment to be in force from 1st January to 31st December, 1868.

A further portion of the Ararat to South-western Sea-board road, commencing at a point five miles north of Yool's Creek Bridge and extending northwards for a distance of two and a half miles.

## WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 20th day of January, 1868, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils and District Board shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 20th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal, two miles and forty-four chains of the Ballarat to Ararat Main road.

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 20th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal two miles and twelve chains of the Ararat to Wickliffe Main road.

The Council of the Shire of Avoca shall, within twelve months from the 20th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal one mile and forty-three chains of the Moonambel Main road.

The Council of the Shire of Glenelg shall, within twelve months from the 20th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal one mile and forty-eight chains of the Casterton to Digby Main road.

The District Board of the Campbell's Creek Road District shall, within twelve months from the 20th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal thirty-four chains and fifty-eight links of the Fryer's Creek to Castlemaine Main road.

The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedule for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under this contract not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor,

failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

10. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

13. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this Contract, the Government, or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be ordered at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contracts satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply; and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1868; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
