COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

DIGBY TOWN COMMON.—The Digby Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 3200 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the town of Digby, and the land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing on the south-western side of the road from Casterton to Digby, at the point where it is intersected by the north boundary of the existing common, the said point bearing west three chains thirty links from the north-west angle of the town of Digby; thence by the said road bearing north-westerly one hundred and thirty-four chains, more or less, to a point bearing south from the south angle of allotment 1 of section 9, parish of Digby; thence crossing the said road by a line bearing north to the said angle of that allotment; thence by the west boundary of allotment 2, bearing north ninety-four chains seven links; thence by a road bearing west one hundred and twenty-one chains fifty links to the west angle of allotment 1; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line and the north boundary of the existing common, bearing east two hundred and twelve chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.R.7178.)

GLENLOGIE GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Glenlogie Gold-field Common, described in two several Proclamations dated respectively the 28th day of January, 1861, and the 23rd day of April, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the two portions of land the respective boundaries of which are hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of the town of Glenlogie; thence by the west boundary thereof, bearing south seventy-nine chains, more or less, to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing west thirty-five chains fifty links, more or less, to the north-western side of the road from Glenlogie to Ararat; thence by that road bearing south-westerly fifty chains, more or less, to a point bearing north from the west angle of suburban allotment 127; thence by a line bearing north one hundred and two chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing east one mile, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area of unappropriated Crown lands, 540 acres, more or less.

Commencing at the north-west angle of the existing common; thence by lines bearing respectively north one mile, east two hundred and eighty chains, and south two hundred and eighty-five chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of the said common; and thence by the eastern and north boundaries thereof, bearing respectively north-westerly two hundred and fifteen chains forty links, and west two hundred chains to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, 3060 acres. Total area of land added to common, 3600 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.5130.)

VILLAGE IN THE PARISH OF MERRIJIG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area, and

the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a village, that is to say:—

VILLAGE IN THE PARISH OF MERRIJIG.—Forty-one acres, more or less, county unnamed, parish of Merrijig, being allotment 17: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 18a, being a point on the right bank of the Delatite River; bounded thence by that allotment and a line bearing north fourteen chains eighty-five links, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment 16b; thence by a line bearing west one chain to the south-east angle of allotment 15 b; thence by that allotment, bearing west thirty-nine chains seventy-one links; thence by a line bearing south two chains fifty links, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river, bearing south-easterly to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(68.Q.5987.)
