W HEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any sold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act. accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say :-
