AMENDING LAND ACT 1865-(Section 42). ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by The Land Act 1862
and The Amending Land Act 1865, His Excellency the
Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by
this present Order, make the following additional Rules and
Regulations relating to applications for and the issue of licenses
under the 42nd section of the said Amending Land Act 1865,
that is to say:

In addition to the land a residual formula.

1. In addition to the lands available for application under the Regulations made and ordered on the 12th February, 1866, lands situated at a greater distance than ten (10) miles and within a distance of thirty (30) miles from the nearest gold-field shall be available for application under the 42nd section of The Amending Land Act 1865.

2. The fees to be paid for occupation of lands within such extended distance from any gold-field shall be at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per acre per annum, payable in advance. Provided that no license shall issue for any less fee than two pounds (£2).

3. The number of licenses to be granted to any applicant for occupation of land within the limit abovementioned shall not exceed eight (8).

4. In addition to the lands heretofore exempted from the operation of the 42nd section of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time exempt from application under that section any lands within the limits aforesaid.

5. The Board of Land and Works shall have power to fix the fees to be charged for survey of such lands.

6. These additional regulatives shall take effect on and after.

6. These additional regulations shall take effect on and after the first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NEW SOUTH WALES.—"THE DISEASES IN SHEEP

THE following Proclamation, which has been extracted from the New South Wales Gazette, No. 197, is published for general information. WILLIAM M. K. VALE,

Whereas by section 49 of an Act of the Parliament of New South Wales, passed in the thirtieth year of the reign of Her persent Majesty, initialed The Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866, and numbered sixteen, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, absolutely prohibit the introduction of sheep from any of the adjoining colonies, for any period not exceeding six months: Now therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, for the period of six months from the date of this Proclamation, absolutely prohibit the introduction of sheep into this colony, otherwise than by sea, from the colony of Victoria, or any sheep which may have, within a period of eighteen months, been in, or in contact with sheep from that colony.
