The following information on the current in the neighborhood of Cape Leuwin and Swan River, on the west coast of Australia, during the summer months (January and Pebruary), is extracted from the Remark Book of Captain Charles W. Hope, of H.M.S. Brisk, 1868:—

"After rounding Cape Leuwin a strong set to the E.N.E. was experienced. At 8 p.m. abreast of Cape Naturaliste, fifteen miles distant, a course was steered to pass eight miles to the westward of Rothnest Island, but at daylight Garden Island was observed on starboard bow and Rothnest Island on the port bow, the ship having been set twenty miles to the E.N.E. during the night. Had the weather been thick, so that the land or Rotnest light could not be distinguished, the ship would have been in a very dangerous position, as the course steered would have led directly on to the reefs north of Garden Island."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863, it is
amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for
ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within
the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelous, or of
any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall
possess property rateable under the said Act within the area
next thereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes
and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than
forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the netannual
value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that
such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon
being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are
true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof,
to constitute such nart of Victoria, under such name as shall in
and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new
road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used
in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district. And
whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the
area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable
property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and
due notice of such petition has been published as provided by
the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof an
Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made, to
constitute the said area a new road district. "Now therefore I,
the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive
Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria
hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name
assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council herein

assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

The Benalla Road District.—Starting on Goulburn River, and by the boundaries of Tallygaroopna, Katandra, Yabba-yabba, St. James, Peechelba, excluding those runs; and by the Ovens River and Fifteen-mile Creek to the north boundary of allotment 6, section F, on that creek; and by that hast boundary and the west boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and west and south boundaries of 1, all of said section F, and by said creek to a point true east from the summit of Futters Range, where crossed by the Sydney road; thence to that crossing and by that range to the summit nearest to the source of Fifteen-mile Creek; thence direct to the eastern source of King River, as far as its western branch; thence by that western branch to its source; thence by the range dividing King and Holland rivers from Broken River to the source; thence by the Back Creek; and by Sandy Creek to its source; thence by the range dividing Sandy Creek for Tallangalouk Creek, continued to and by the south-west boundaries of Wangambehan and Killen runs, and by Prangib Creek and Goulburn River to the starting point.
