LOMMON.

1. Every householder residing in the township of Corop may depasture four horses or six head of horned cattle.

2. Every farmer or occupier of land may depasture one head of cattle or horses to every 3 acres under cultivation, and one head to every 15 acres in grass, but in no case shall the number of cattle or horses exceed fifty head.

3. The fees to be paid for depasturing cattle or horses shall be as follows. viz.:—

4. For every head of horned cattle over 12 months old, 5s. per

annum.

5. For every horse over 12 months old, 6s. per annum.

6. For calves or foals over 6 months and under 12 months old,

7. All fees shall be paid in advance for a period not less than

6. For calves or foals over 6 months and under 12 months oid, half price.
7. All fees shall be paid in advance for a period not less than four months.
8. Persons having right of commonage by virtue of occupancy of land may, with the consent of the managers, transfer such right to any other boad fade occupier of land having right to commonage, but the rights of commonage of householders in the township not to be transferable.

9. The managers of the common may from time to time employ a herdsman, secretary, or such other labor they may require, and pay them out of the common fees, and require them to give such security for the due fulfilment of their duties as may seem necessary.
10. The managers may erect yards or incur other expenses necessary for the proper working of the common and pay the cost of such out of the common fees, and may make arrangements for receiving and branding cattle on such common, and for returning the same to the owners thereof.
11. No entire horse shall be allowed to run upon the common nor any bull except such as may be approved of by the nanagers.
12. Cattle shall not be taken off the common without notice being given to the herdsman by the owner of such eatile, except in the case of milch cows or working horses or working bullocks.
13. No diseased cattle shall be placed upon the common, and cattle becoming diseased after being placed thereon shall be removed within twenty-four hours after receiving, notice from the herdsman, and in case such cattle be not removed within the expense of the common at any time not be fully stocked the managers may proportionately increase the number of cattle that may be depastured by persons having rights of commonage.
15. The managers of the common to possess the right of suspending or altering such of the above rules as may be lound necessary, subject to the sanction of the Shire Council.
