part of any agricultural area has been selected under The Land
Act 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the
Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased
portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the
quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for
the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the
Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council,
do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in
accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is
