## MINISTRY OF THE COLONIES.-ROYAL DECREE. [Translation.]

For the reasons set forth by the Minister of the Colonies in accordance with the Council of Ministers I decree the following:—

Art. 1. With regard to the exaction of Port and Navigation Dues in Cuba, Puerto Rico, and the Philippine Islands equality shall exist between Spanish vessels and the ships of all those nations which may in their respective territories and colonies make the like concession to Spanish vessels proceeding from the ports of the above-mentioned islands, and from the ports of the peninsula and adjacent islands.

Art. 2. Reciprocity in the payment of the said dues shall come into operation in the colonies with regard to the vessels of each nation on the day of publication in the Gazette of the Order by which the said reciprocity may be determined.

  1. Marking off and shepherding claims.—On the day on which any claim shall be taken possession of one of the shareholders must remain thereon for two consecutive hours between Nine a.m. and Noon, and on every succeeding day each shareholder in such claim must be present thereon during the time above mentioned, until work is commenced and continued in a bond fide manner; but where a claim has been marked out at such an hour as to render it impossible to shepherd during the hours named, then the person shall, if marking out before Twelve o'clock at noon, shepherd the proportion of time that is practicable, and if subsequent to the hour of noon he shall not be compelled to shepherd on that day: provided always that in the case of any such shareholder being a female, or male under fourteen years of age, the same must be represented by a competent miner. No share or interest in any claim being shepherded shall under any circumstances become liable to forfeiture unless through absence from such claim during the hours specified above. But no person holding a share or interest at the same time, unless such share or interest be represented by a miner other than himself, and in all respects in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law.

STANDING ORDERS BYE-LAW.-[27th August, 1868.]

A Ta Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the twenty-seventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, it is ordained by the said board, as follows, that is to say:—

1. Repealing clause.—The bye-law of the 17th day of October, 1859, with reference to the standing orders of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Maryborough, shall be and the same is hereby repealed and rescinded, and the following enacted in-

2. Business conducted with open doors, but any one member present may require the exclusion of strangers during the discussion of any question, and any person not being a member of said board who shall refuse to retire from the board-room when requested to do so by the chairman of any meeting of said board, shall be guilty of a breach of this bye-law.

3. Minutes shall be taken.—That minutes of the proceedings of each meeting of the board shall be taken regularly and entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and an attendance book shall also be kept, in which the names of all members who attend any meeting of said board within half an hour after any such meeting shall have commenced, shall be entered; and after after provided, shall be entitled to have his name entered in such book as being present at a meeting of said board on the day for which such meeting has been convened; and the entries in such book may be revised before the close or adjournment of any resolution of said board, be expunged therefrom, and the name of any member nettered therein may, by resolution of said board, be expunged therefrom, and the name of any member not present at any meeting, before the expiration of the said half-hour, but who may afterwards attend such meeting, may, with the sanction of the board, be entered in such book, and the members whose names are so entered shall alone be considered to have been present at such meeting.

4. When there is not a quorum, names recorded.—At any time appointed for the board to meet, when there is not a quorum of the members present, or when the board is counted out, such circumstance, together with the names of the members.—The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be for any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be

5. Minutes of preceding meeting first business.—The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted

thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings of the board, and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, they shall be signed by the chairman.

6. Order of business.—That the following shall be the order of business:—I. Confirmation of minutes; 2. Correspondence and incidental business; 3. Motions of which notice has been given; 4. Fresh notices of motion.

#### ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

7. Calls of the board.—Calls of the board may be made by the chairman, on a written application signed by at least two members of the board, and stating the business for which such call

pers of the board, and stating the business for which such call is requested.

8. Fine for non-attendance.—Should a call for a full meeting of the members of the board be made, any member who does not attend such meeting shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this bye-law, unless he shall furnish to the board a satisfactory reason for his absence.

9. Seven days' notice for a call of the board.—No order for a call of the board shall be made for any day earlier than seven days from the date of such order, inclusive of the day of such order.

10. Copy of order shall be sent to each member.—A copy of the order for a call of the board shall be forwarded to each member of the board, signed by the chairman or clerk.

11. Breach of order No. 8.—At every call of the board, so soon as the minutes of the previous meeting have been read and confirmed, the names of the members shall be called over, and any member not being present before the expiration of the half hour provided by the Act shall be considered to have broken standing order No. 8.

#### NOTICES AND MOTIONS.

12. Notices of motion, motions and amendments to motions, to be written and signed.—That all notices of motion, motions and amendments to motions, must be in writing, and signed by the mover and seconder; and no resolution of the board shall be rescinded except notice thereof be given at the meeting next preceding.

mover and seconder; and no resolution at the meeting next prescinded except notice thereof be given at the meeting next preceding.

13. One member may give notice of motion for an absent member. —A member may give notice of motion for any other member not then present, by putting the name of the member for whom the notice is signed on the notice of motion.

14. Members who have given notice shall be present.—No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

16. Motions not seconded shall lapse.—Any motion not seconded shall not be further debated, but shall lapse.

16. Motions proposed and seconded.—When a motion has been proposed and seconded, a question thereon shall be proposed to the board by the chairman.

17. Motions may be withdrawn.—A member who has proposed a motion may withdraw the same by leave of the board; but should such motion be seconded, such leave can only be granted provided there be no negative voice.

18. Questions may be superseded.—A question may be superseded—1st, by the adjournment of the board on the motion of a member "That the board do now adjourn," 2nd, by the previous question, viz., "That the question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

19. Questions shall be put.—So soon as the debate upon a question shall be concluded, the chairman shall put the question to the hoard in a distinct and audible manner.

20. Fotings.—The question being put, shall be resolved in the affirmative or negative by the majority of voices "aye" or "no."

21. Chairman shall give his opinion.—The chairman shall state whether in his opinion the "ayes" or the "noes" have it, and unless his opinion be acquiesced in by the minority the question shall be resolved by a division.

22. Questions once carried cannot be questioned again.—A question being once made and carried in the affirmative or negative, cannot be questioned again at the same sitting during which it has been so resolved.

23. Questions may be amended.—A question having been proposed, may be amended by leaving out certain words or by inserting or adding words.

24. Amendments and contains a contain words.

24. Amendments not seconded.—An amendment proposed but not seconded will not be entertained by the board nor entered

25. Amendment of the most seconded will not be entertained by the board nor entered in the minutes.

25. Amendment to leave out words.—When the proposed amendment is to leave out certain words the chairman shall put a question, "That the words proposed to be left out stand part of the question," which shall be resolved by the board in the affirmative or negative, as the case may be.

Amendment to substitute words.—When the proposed amendment is to leave out certain words in order to insert or add other words, the chairman shall put a question, "That the words proposed to be left out stand part of the question," which, if resolved in the affirmative, will dispose of the amendment; but if in the negative, and there is no motion before the board for amending the proposed amendment, another question shall be put "That the words of the amendment be inserted or added instead thereof," which shall be resolved in the affirmative or negative, as the case may be.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Mejesty's reign, intituled An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health (31 Vict.
