Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Acting Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

BOROUGH COUNCIL.—BYE-LAW No. 1.

BYE-LAW FOR THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS FOR THE ECHUCA BOROUGH COMMON.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 25 Victoria No. 145, section 69, it is provided that the Municipal Council of any District within or in the vicinity of which any town common is situated, shall elect annually, in such manner as they may respectively by bye-law prescribe, three persons to be Managers of such Town Common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers: Be it therefore enacted by the Borough Council of Echuca:—

That all meetings of council for the election of manager or managers shall be specially convened for that purpose.

That no person shall be nominated or elected for manager without his assent in writing, and such assent must be in the hands of the town clerk at least seven days before the day of election.

That votes shall be taken by ballot, and shall be counted, in presence of the members, by the chairman, assisted by one of the council and by the town clerk.

That in the event of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote.

That the chairman, upon ascertaining the result of the voting, shall declare the names of the successful candidates to the council.

That the town clerk shall then enter such declaration in the Minute-book, and acquaint, in writing, the persons elected of their election as Managers of the Echuca Town Common.

That on the death, resignation, or removal by the council of any manager the council shall elect another in his stead, and the person so elected shall hold office for the remainder of the term his predecessor would have been entitled to hold it.
