## ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1862."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of September, 1868.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Land Act* 1862, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation relating to the issue of Licenses under the 53rd clause of the said Act, to occupy portions of Crown lands in the vicinity of Footscray for obtaining and removing stone therefrom, that is to say:—

The Board of Land and Works may issue, through the agency of commissioners of Crown lands, receivers of revenue, or collectors of impost, licenses which shall entitle the holders thereof respectively to occupy Crown lands in the vicinity of Footscray, not exceeding in extent half an acre, in such position as may be approved by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of quarrying and removing stone therefrom, on condition that the number of men employed in quarrying and shipping stone from any site so licensed shall not exceed six (6), and, subject to payment in advance, quarterly, of an annual license fee of Ten pounds (£10).

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
