CAUTION AGAINST KEEPING LUNATICS IN UNLICENSED HOUSES.

THERE being reason to suspect that certain persons are infringing the provisions of the 34th section of the Lunacy Statute, and that they are not aware that by so doing they incur the penalties of a misdemeanor, a copy of that section is published below for general information, viz. —

32 VICT. No. 309.

"34. It shall not be lawful for any person to receive two or more lunatics into any house, unless such house shall be an asylum or an hospital or a house for the time being duly licensed under this Act; and any person who shall receive two or more lunatics into any house other than a house for the time being duly licensed as aforesaid, or an asylum or an hospital under this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."
