MORTLAKE COUNTY COURT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of November, 1868.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The County Courts Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court, or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden; and it is also enacted that the judge of each county court shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act shall be held at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At MORTLAKE, once at least in every six calendar months.

And the Honorable James Joseph Casey, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A PROCLAIMED ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next thereafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district" where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof an

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Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made, to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

THE GOULBURN VALLEY ROAD DISTRICT.—Starting by the south-west boundaries of Wangambeh and Killeen Runs, and following the waters of Franjib Creek to the Goulburn River; thence up that river and by the boundary of Longwood electoral division, but excluding sections A and B of Avenel parish, to the starting point.

PROCLAMATION OF A DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, and upon the application of the Council of the borough of Buninyong, do hereby revoke a previous proclamation bearing date the thirty-first day of October, 1864, whereby it was declared that the whole of the 'borough of Buninyong should be a district wherein Beer Licenses might be granted.

COMMONS IN AGRICULTURAL AREAS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thoreafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BRIDGEWATER AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Bridgewater Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of January, 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land enumerated as follow, viz., parish of Bridgewater, allotments 28a, 28b, 29a, 29b, 30a, 30b, 31a, 31b, 32a, 32b, 46a, 46b, 47a, 47b, 62b, 63a, 63b, 64a, 65a, 65b, 66a, 66b, 122a, 122b, 123a, 123b; parish of Yarraberr, allotments 1a, 1b, 2a, 2b, of section 36; allotments 1a, 1b, of section 37, allotments 1a, 1b, 2a and 2b, of section 38. Area of land added to common, 5664 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.10541.)

CHILTERN AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 876 acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a farmers' common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Chiltern, viz., allotments 1a, 1b, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 12, and allotments 1a, 1b, 2a, 2b, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 13, all in the parish of Chiltern.—(68.Q.13214.)

IRREWARRA AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 6763 acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Irrewarra, viz.:—Parish of Yeo, allotments 48a, 49a, 49b, 68a, 68b, 69a, 69b, 114, 115; parish of Gerangamete, allotments 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 50, 51, 52, and 53.—(68.R.9952.)

IRREWILLIPE AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 11,119 acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Irrewillipe, viz.:—Parish of Irrewillipe, allotments 5, 6, 9, 16, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 67, 70, 71, 80, and part of allotment 4; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.Q.13465.)

SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF FARMERS' COMMONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.

ALL householders in the township or parish of Mortlake to be allowed to depasture four head of cattle, or in lieu thereof two horses, in the proportion of one horse to two head of cattle; bullock drivers and teamsters resident in Mortlake to be allowed to depasture one team of not more than eight working bullocks or four horses, in addition to their right as residents. Farmers cultivating fifteen acres and under to be allowed one head of cattle for every cultivated acre, and in excess of fifteen cultivated acres to depasture not more than one head of cattle for every five acres cultivated.

2. The fees for depasturing stock to be as follow:—Horses, Twelve shillings per annum; cattle, Six shillings per annum; goats, Twelve shillings per annum; sheep, One shilling per annum.

3. All horses and cattle above twelve months old shall be subject to commonage fees.

4. Licenses may be obtained from the managers, or such person as they may appoint.

5. No bulls allowed on the commons, unless approved of by the managers.

Entire horses strictly prohibited.

6. The herdsman shall not take or put off registered cattle without the direction of the managers.

7. All persons unnecessarily disturbing cattle on the commons shall be dealt with according to clause No. 129 of *The Land Act 1862*.

8. No person shall be allowed to depasture cattle or horses on the commons, unless duly registered and fees paid.

9. Any stock found trespassing on the commons shall be dealt with according as the managers may direct.

10. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance.

11. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the commons without giving notice to the herdsman, excepting working stock and cows giving milk.

12. No person shall be allowed to depasture cattle or horses on the commons, unless branded with the commonage pitch brand.

13. No person shall be allowed to depasture stock or horses on the commons of the shire who is a holder of a license to depasture on any other common in respect of the same holding.

14. Any person breaking any of the rules may on the managers' report to the council be refused a renewal of his license.

15. One herdsman and an assistant shall be appointed to attend to the common and keep the accounts of the same.

16. The managers shall not be responsible for the stock placed in charge of the herdsman.

17. About one hundred acres to be set apart for sheep (the property of butchers) outside the town boundary.

18. All cattle and horses are to be the *bond fide* property of applicants for commonage; and when parties register their cattle they must make a declaration to that effect.

19. No person shall be allowed to depasture geese on the commons.
