NOTICE TO IMPORTERS AND OTHERS.

SEVERAL instances having recently occurred of importations of tobacco in which two or three complete packages have been strapped or fastened together so as to make an aggregate weight of 60 pounds or upwards; importers and others are warned that such a proceeding is a violation of the 34th section of the *Customs Act 1857*, which absolutely prohibits [*inter alia*] the importation into Victoria of "snuff or tobacco unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least and in whole and complete packages, each containing not less than sixty pounds nett weight, and not containing any other goods."

Any violation of the above provisions renders the goods liable to forfeiture.

WHEREAS by *The County Courts Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court, or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden; and it is also enacted that the judge of each county court shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act shall be held at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At STEIGLITZ, once at least in every four calendar months.

And the Honorable Samuel Henry Bindon, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, BARK, ETC., ON OR FROM CERTAIN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION*

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall do the following acts on or with respect to the portions of Crown Lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF ECHUCA AND THE VICINITY.—No person shall cut or remove live timber or bark from the unappropriated Crown lands in the borough of Echuca, and within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of the borough of Echuca, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the east boundary of that borough, bearing south to the south-west angle of allotment 45 in the parish of Echuca North; thence by a road, bearing east eighty chains to the south-east angle of allotment 46; thence by a road, bearing north one hundred and fifty-six chains eighty links to the north-east angle of allotment 10; thence by a road, bearing N. 69° 40' E. sixty chains; thence by a line, bearing north six chains, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river, bearing westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(67.O.13494.)

PARISH OF MALDON.—No person shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, viz.: Parish of Maldon, allotments 6, 7, the unappropriated portion of allotment 8, and allotment 9, all of section 1 A. Area, seven hundred and eighteen acres, more or less.—(67.P.13649.)

PARISH OF YAN YEAN.—No person shall cut or remove live or dead timber, or bark, or stone, or gravel, from the unappropriated Crown lands in section 13, in the parish of Yan Yeau.—(67.P.14382.)

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.—No person shall cut or remove live timber from the unappropriated Crown lands within the Shire of Bellarine.—(67.O.14222.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Court of General Sessions of the Peace at Inglewood to be holden on Thursday, the twentieth day of February next ensuing, instead of the thirtieth day of January instant, as appointed by a former Proclamation.

UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold-field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned, to be a United Common, under the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TEESDALE AND INVERLEIGH UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The United Town and Farmers' Common of Teesdale, described in a Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of February, 1866, and the portion of the Inverleigh Farmers' Common which lies within the Shire of Leigh, and which was constituted a separate common by Order of the Governor in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, 1865, are hereby united under the name of the United Town and Farmers' Common of Teesdale and Inverleigh; and the said United Common shall be for the use and benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-named commons.—(67.O.14926.)

NOTICE RELATIVE TO THE ENGAGEMENT OF
SEAMEN IN VICTORIA.

THE attention of the Government having been drawn to certain recent instances where seamen have been illegally supplied to be entered on board vessels by persons not authorized so to do by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs has directed the publication of the following sections of that Act for general information.

In future none but Officers of the Government Shipping Office, and those persons included in the undermentioned section, clauses (1) and (2), will be allowed to engage or supply seamen or apprentices to be entered on board ships sailing from ports in the colony.

Measures will be taken to muster the crews of vessels leaving Victoria, and the penalties will be strictly enforced when it is proved that seamen have been so illegally supplied or received.

17 & 18 VICT. CH. 104, SECTIONS 147 & 148, ADOPTED BY THE
"SEAMEN STATUTE 1865."

147. The following offences shall be punishable as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

For supplying seamen without license—

(1). If any person not licensed as aforesaid, other than the owner or master or a mate of the ship, or some person who is *bona fide* the servant and in the constant employ of the owner, or a shipping master duly appointed as aforesaid, engages or supplies any seaman or apprentice to be entered on board any ship in the United Kingdom, he shall for each seaman or apprentice so engaged or supplied incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

For employing unlicensed persons—

(2). If any person employs any unlicensed person other than persons so excepted as aforesaid, for the purpose of engaging or supplying any seaman or apprentice to be entered on board any ship in the United Kingdom, he shall for each seaman or apprentice so engaged or supplied incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if licensed shall in addition forfeit his license.

For receiving seamen illegally supplied—

(3). If any person knowingly receives or accepts to be entered on board any ship any seaman or apprentice who has been engaged or supplied contrary to the provisions of this Act, he shall, for every seaman or apprentice so engaged or supplied, incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

148. Penalty for receiving remuneration from seamen for shipping them.—If any person demands or receives, either directly or indirectly, from any seaman or apprentice, or from any person seeking employment as a seaman or apprentice, or from any person on his behalf, any remuneration whatever, other than the fees hereby authorized, for providing him with employment, he shall, for every such offence, incur a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

VENDING FRUIT, ETC., IN PUBLIC GARDENS AND
PARKS.

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, have made the following Regulation with reference to the sale of Fruit or other Eatables, Goods, Wares, Merchandise, and Liquors within the several undermentioned reserves, viz:—

The Fitz Roy Garden,

The Albert Park,
The Treasury Reserve, and
Studley Park.

The selling or offering for sale within any of the above-named reserves of fruit or other eatables, goods, wares, merchandise, or liquors, by persons not specially authorized in that behalf by the Board of Land and Works, is hereby prohibited.

Offenders against this Regulation will, in accordance with the 67th section of *The Amending Land Act of 1865*, be liable, on conviction before any justice, to pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any regulation, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—REGULATING ALLUVIAL MINING IN A
PART OF THE ARARAT DIVISION OF THE ARARAT MINING
DISTRICT.—[12th November, 1867.]

At a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the sixteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

The following bye-law shall be applicable to all claims situated in that part of the Ararat division of the Ararat mining district commencing at a fixed Government survey mark, being the north-west angle of allotment number 1, section 31, parish of Langi Ghiran, and situated on the boundary between the parishes of Langi Ghiran and Ararat, and also on the southern frontage of the main road from Ararat to Ballarat; thence south by the said parish boundary one hundred and seventy chains; thence west two hundred chains; thence north one hundred and sixty-eight chains; thence east thirty-eight chains fifty links; thence north one hundred and twenty chains; thence east sixty-chains; thence north ninety-seven chains; thence east twenty chains, thence north forty-four chains; thence east eighty-one chains fifty links to a point on the parish boundary of Ararat; thence south by the said parish boundary of Ararat two hundred and fifty-nine chains to the point of commencement; such area being deemed to require the application of steam machinery for the purpose of mining thereon, and the greater portion thereof being situated on the basaltic rock formation.

1. *Extent of claims.*—The extent of claims shall be eighty (80) feet in length for each man, and claims may be any width not exceeding their entire length.

2. *Mode of taking possession.*—Any person or company taking possession of a claim, shall define its area by firmly fixing in the ground at each corner of the claim a post which shall project at least four (4) feet above the surface, such posts to be kept visible during the working of such claim.

3. *Registration.*—All claims shall be registered within eight (8) days after possession of the same has been taken, or if amalgamated, such amalgamation shall be registered within eight (8) days of the day on which amalgamation has taken place.

4. *Mode of working.*—Within eight (8) days after registration, the holders of claims, or as many of them as can from time to time be properly employed thereon, shall *bond fide* proceed to work, and shall continue to work regularly upon or in connection with such claims according to the usual course and practice of efficient mining. Provided nevertheless any person may work his share or interest by contract, hired labor, or otherwise, and the title of such person to such share or interest shall not be invalidated by reason of such work being done by a smaller number of men than are registered in respect to the claim, provided such claim be worked efficiently.

5. *Efficient mining.*—For the purpose of this bye-law, efficient mining shall be the employment of such appliances, and such a number of men as shall be necessary to carry on the work in its various stages with reasonable expedition.

6. *Amalgamation.*—The holders of adjoining claims may amalgamate, and such amalgamated claims shall be considered as one claim, and work done on any portion of such claims or amalgamated claims, shall be considered as work done in respect of the entire of such amalgamated claims; and so long as efficient mining operations are carried on upon any portion of such amalgamated claims, no person shall be entitled, on the ground of forfeiture or abandonment, to take possession of or occupy any portion of such amalgamated claims without the consent, in writing, of the owners of such amalgamated claims.

7. *Rights of holders under previous bye-laws.*—Any person or company occupying any claim or claims under any bye-law in force previous to the passing of this bye-law, shall be at liberty, without relinquishing any rights or privileges which they may hold under such bye-law in so far as such rights or privileges relate to the area or tenure of such claims, to take advantage of all and every of the privileges conferred by this bye-law. And any person or company, or agent, or trustee or trustees for any company holding any claim or amalgamated claims in that part of the Ararat division of the Ararat mining district to which this bye-law refers, shall be entitled to register the same under this bye-law, with either separate miners' rights, or with a consolidated miner's right.

8. *Protection to claimholders.*—Claimholders employed in procuring machinery, timber, or other appliances, or at any work necessary to the forwarding the progress of a claim or amalgamated claims, shall be held in lawful possession of such claim or claims.

9. *Effacing notices or removing pegs.*—No person shall wilfully efface, alter, remove, or destroy any notice posted on a claim or amalgamated claims, or any boundary-pegs thereof.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately. Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures. As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be ordered at a time for the convenience of contractors. The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty. Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contracts satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies. CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.
2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.
8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.
9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1863; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
