FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honourable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, now stand prorogued until Tuesday, the twenty-second day of December instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria, from Tuesday, the twenty-second day of December instant, until Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

HYDRA ROCK, CAPE SAUNDERS.
NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th of September last the *Hydra* struck, and received considerable damage, in the vicinity of Cape Saunders. She was drawing eighteen feet, and it was nearly low-water springs at the time of the accident. Captain Rich, of the *Hydra*, gives the following as the bearings of the place where she struck:—

Cape Saunders ... S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.
Funnel of *Victory* (wreck in Wickliffe Bay) S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
Woman's Head (most easterly land near Tairua Head) ... N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.
Captain Tall, of the s.s. *Tairua*, reports having seen a "break," on very similar bearings, in August last, and others have since stated that they knew of a danger in that locality; its exact position has not however been as yet determined, and mariners are warned to exercise great caution when near the position indicated by the bearings, and are also requested to forward to this office any information likely to aid in determining the true position of the rock.

So far as present information is to be depended on, a vessel will be clear inside the most westerly reported position of the danger so long as "Woman's" or "East Head" is shut in by Remarkable Cliff Point, and will be clear outside the most easterly reported position so long as "East Head" is brought nothing to the north of N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

THE WEST AND EAST RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF AVON ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added; and it is also enacted, that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save wherein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifth day of September, 1864, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Avon Road District," and whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the second day of October, 1865, the said road district was constituted the Shire of Avon; and whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the thirteenth day of August, 1866, the said shire was divided into three separate electoral subdivisions called Ridings: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the West and East Ridings respectively a portion of the colony lying north-east of and adjoining to such ridings respectively, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add separately to the West and East Ridings of the said Shire of Avon a portion of the colony adjoining to such two ridings respectively (such portion not lying within the city or town above-mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define each of the said ridings added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the south-west corner of the parish of Tenamba, on the River Thomson; thence along

the Thomson River in a westwardly direction to a point about ten miles; thence due north to about one mile north of the junction of Hickey's Creek with the Macalister River; thence up that river in a northwardly direction to the junction of Wellington River with the Macalister; thence due east to the Dividing Range; thence down that range in a southwardly direction to the source of the River Avon; thence down the Avon River to the junction of Valencia Creek.

EAST RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of Valencia Creek with the River Avon; thence along the Avon River to its source; thence up the Range to the north-east boundary of the West Riding; thence due east to Bairnsdale Shire boundary; thence along the western boundary of Bairnsdale Shire to its termination with the Avon Shire; thence along the parish boundary of Stratford due west to the River Avon; thence up that river to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 219), intituled *An Act to consolidate the Law relating to Gaols*, it is amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, that the police lock-up at Snowy Creek, situate on the land hereinafter described, is a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—
