FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, now stand prorogued until Tuesday, the twenty-second day of December instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria, from Tuesday, the twenty-second day of December instant, until Tuesday, the twentysixth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

Wather things and the process of the colony actually adjoining to the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added; and it is also enacted, that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save wherein otherwise exprosely provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifth day of September, 1864, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Avon Road District," and whereas by mother Proclamation bearing date the second day of October, 1865, the said road district was constituted the Shire of Avon; and whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the thirteenth day of August, 1866, the said shire was divided into three separate electoral subdivisions called Ridings: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the West and East Ridings res

WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the south-west corner of the parish of Tenambs, on the River Thomson; thence along

the Thomson River in a westwardly direction to a point about ten miles; thence due north to about one mile north of the junction of Hickey's Creek with the Macalister River; thence up that river in a northwardly direction to the junction of Wellington River with the Macalister; thence due east to the Dividing Runge; thence down that range in a southwardly direction to the source of the River Avon; thence down the Avon River to the junction of Valencia Creek.

East Riding.—Commencing at the junction of Valencia Creek with the River Avon; thence along the Avon River to its source; thence up the Range to the north-east boundary of the West Riding; thence due east to Bairnsdale Shire boundary; thence along the western boundary of Birnsdale Shire to its termination with the Avon Shire; thence along the parish boundary of Stratford due west to the River Avon; thence up that river to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Minjesty's reign (No. 219), intituled An Act to consolidate the Law relating to Gools, it is amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public goals, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, as such public goals, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public goals, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "goals") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the soveral provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public goals, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners condined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every goal shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice to the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the police lock-up at Snowy Creek, situate on the land hereinafter described, is a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is it say:—
