WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by nim, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which directive courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: Now therefore His Execlerey the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the places and times at which the several Circuit Courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine to be as follow, that is to say:—

At ARARAT, on-

Tuesday the sixteenth day of February. Tuesday the twentieth day of July.

At BALLARAT, on-

Thursday the eighteenth day of February. Saturday the tenth day of April.

Thursday the twenty-second day of July. Tuesday the fifth day of October.

At BERCHWORTH, on-

Wednesday the twenty-first day of April. Wednesday the thirteenth day of October.

At BELFAST, on

Thursday the eleventh day of February. Thursday the fifteenth day of July.

At CASTLEMAINE, on-

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE DANDENONG ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of December, 1868.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (thereinafter sometimes called "single district,") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a potition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (thereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date fifth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Dandenong Road District," and the boundaries of the said road district were altered by other Proclamations bearing date respectively the nineteenth day of March, 1857, and the twenty-ninth day of September, 1862. And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, iraying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Dandenong Road District into three separate electoral subdivisio

THE NORTH SUBDIVISION.—Starting by the north boundary of section VI. Mordialloc parish, direct to and by the north boundary of Police Paddock, Dandenong parish to Dandenong Creek; thence down that creek and by the south boundary of that paddock, viz., the Mornington road, direct to and by the south boundary of section XI., Mordialloc parish, and by the west boundary of said sections XI. and VI. to the starting point.

THE CENTER SUBDIVISION.—Starting by the north boundary of section XIV., Mordialloc parish, viz., Mornington road, direct to and by the south boundary of Police Paddock to Dandenong Creek; thence down that creek and by, the boundary of and including Dandenong town, and again down that Creek to the south boundary of section LI., Dandenong parish; thence by that last boundary, viz., the Brighton road, direct to and by the south boundary of section XIX., Mordialloo parish; thence by the western boundaries of sections XIX. and XIV. to the starting point.

THE SOUTH SUBDIVISION.—Starting by the eastern boundary of the Aboriginal Reserve and west boundary of section XXII. Mordialloc parish, and by the north boundary of said section, viz., Brighton road, direct to and by the south boundary of section LI. Dandenong, parish, and by the boundaries of Dandenong and Mordialloc parishes southwardly and westwardly to the starting point.
