THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE KEILOR ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of December, 1868.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (thereinafter sometimes called "single district") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if ne shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (thereinafter called subdivisions), by such names, as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be assigned for the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, hearing date the twenty-third day of Februray, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of the "Kelior Road District." And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, divide the Keilor Road District into three separate electorial subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE MARIBYANONG SUBDIVISION.—Starting by the south boundary of section V. Maribyrnong parish; thence by the south, west, and north boundaries of that parish, the west boundary of sections XXX and XXV, the south boundaries of sections XXV, XXVIII. the Saltwater River, and the east and south boundaries of section XII., all of said parish, to the south boundary of section V. aforesaid.

THE TULLMARINE SUBDIVISION.—Starting on Saltwater River by the boundaries of, and including sections XXVIII., XXVII. XXVI, XXV, and XXIX. Maribyrnong parish, the north boundaries of sections IX, VIII., and VII., and VIII., and VIII., III. III. III. III. The boundaries of sections IV., III., III., and II., Tullamarine parish, to and by Deep Creek road, the south boundaries of sections IV., III., II., and II., Tullamarine parish, and by Saltwater River to the starting point.

WHEREAS by the second section of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 323, intituled An Act to amend the Law relating to Boroughs, Shires, and Road Districts, power is given to the council of every borough beyond the distance of eight miles from the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne, or the town of Geelong, from time to time to make such byelaws as they shall think fit for the licensing and regulating hackney carriages plying for hire within such borough, and the owners and drivers of such hackney carriages, and for fixing the situation and number of public stands for such hackney carriages, the number of persons to be carried in the same, and the amount of fares for time or distance to be paid for the use thereof.

And whereas it has been deemed expedient and necessary to make the following bye-law in reference to hackney carriages plying for hire within the borough of Sebastopol:

HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND PROPRIETORS.

No Person to let to Hire a Hackney Carriage without a License

1. No person shall let to hire or ply for hire with any hackney carriage at any place within the borough of Sebastopol unless such person shall have a license in force so to do under the provisions of this bye-law.

Upon production of such certificate at the office of the town clerk of the borough, a license in the form or to the effect in the 3rd schedule hereto shall be granted, which shall be dated on the day on which the same shall be issued, and take effect from the date thereof until the first day of January thence next ensuing, or until the same shall be voluntarily surrendered by the party named therein; or otherwise be determined, suspended, or revoked under the provision's hereinafter contained. The driver of every hackney, carriage shall on each occasion when such carriage shall be hired deliver, to the hirer thereof a card, on which shall be printed in legible letters and figures the words "Borough of Sebastopol," the driver's name and the number of his license, and on the reverse side of, the said card, in such form as the council may direct, a statement of the fares for the time being in force.

The driver of any hackney carriage shall not suffer any other person to act as driver of such hackney carriage without the consent of the proprietor thereof, and no person, whether licensed or not, shall act as driver or conductor of any such carriage without the consent of the proprietor. But nothing herein contained shall prevent any proprietor from employing any unlicensed person to act as such driver as aforesaid for any time not exceeding twenty-four hours, in case of unavoidable necessity. necessity.

LICENSES AND TICKETS.

Licenses to be on Parchment with Columns.

18. Every license of a driver shall be on parchment, with proper columns, in which every proprietor employing the driver named in such license shall enter his own name and address, and the day on which such driver shall enter and quit his service respectively, and in case any of the particulars entered or endorsed upon any license in pursuance of this bye-law shall be erased or defaced, every such license shall be wholly void and of none effect.

19. At the time of issuing any license to any driver, there shall be delivered to him, by the person issuing the same, a copy of this bye-law, and of every other bye-law hereafter to be in force relating to the same subject.

Renewal of Licenses.

20. Every license to keep, use, and let to hire any hackney carriage shall be renewed from year to year, and such renewed license shall bear date on the day next after the expiration of the former license, but if subsequently applied for shall bear date on the day of the application.

Particulars of Licenses to be entered in Books at Council Office.

21. The particulars of every license which shall be granted under this bye-law shall be entered in books to be kept at the office of the borough council.

22. Upon the expiration or revocation of any license granted under this Act, the person to whom such license shall have been granted shall deliver such license, at the office of the borough council, to the town clerk.

Proprietor to retain the License of Driver employed by him.

23. Every proprietor of a hackney carriage who shall permit or employ any licensed person to act as the driver thereof, shall require to be delivered to him, and shall retain in his possession the license of such driver while such driver shall remain in his service. And when such licensed driver shall leave the service of such proprietor, he shall upon demand thereof return to such driver his license.

24. The places mentioned in the sixth schedule to this byelaw shall be public stands for hackney carriages to the number of such carriages specified in the said schedule; and all such carriages shall take their stations on the several stands in the order of their arrival at the time; and when any carriage shall be called or drive off any stand, the carriage immediately behind shall draw to the place vacated, and any other carriage behind in the like order. Provided that at every fourth carriage on each stand there shall be let a space of at least eight feet for passengers to pass through.

RATES AND FARES AND DISTANCES.

SCHEDULE VII .- Tables of Fares to be painted on Carriages.

25. The proprietor or driver of any hackney carriage shall be entitled to demand, and to take for the hire of such carriage, the fares set forth in the seventh schedule hereto.

26. The proprietor of any hackney carriage shall put up, and at all times keep distinctly painted thereon in some conspicuous place, as the council may from time to time direct, the amount of fare according to distance and time which may be legally demanded and taken from the hirer of such carriage.

Hackney Carriages standing in any Street shall be deemed to be plying for Hire.

27. Every hackney carriage which shall be found standing in any street or place, having a horse harnessed thereto, and being equipped for use, shall, unless actually hired, or unless such driver have a reasonable excuse, be deemed to be plying for hire, although such hackney carriage shall not be on any standing or place usually appropriated for the purpose of backney carriages standing or plying for hire; and the driver of every such hackney carriage which shall not be actually hired shall be obliged and compellable to go with any person desirous of using such hackney carriage to any place within the borough, or for any time not exceeding one hour.

Agreement to pay more than Legal Fare not binding.

28. No agreement whatever made with the proprietor or driver of any backney carriage for the payment of more than his proper fare shall be binding or held to authorize any overcharge whatever.

SCHEDULE VII .- Speed on Hiring by Time.

29. When any hackney carriage shall have been hired by time, the driver thereof may be required to drive at any rate not exceeding six miles within one hour, and if the driver of such carriage shall be required to drive more than six miles within an hour, then in every such case the driver thereof shall be entitled to demand, in addition to the fare regulated by time in the seventh schedule hereto, for every mile, or any part thereof, exceeding six miles, the fare regulated by distance as set forth in the same schedule.

For Offences.

30. Every person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such

Frand in obtaining License.

31. No person applying for or attempting to procure any license under this bye-law shall make or cause to be made on any false representation in any requisition to the council, or shall endeavour to obtain a license by any forged recommendation, or shall untruly answer any question which shall be demanded of him in relation to such application for a license.

Retaining License or using Forged Tickets.

32. No person licensed under this bye-law shall after the expiration or revocation of such license wilfully retsin the same in his possession for three days, or shall use any ticket without having a license in force relating to such ticket, or shall for the purpose of deception use or have any ticket resembling or intending to resemble any ticket in use under the authority of this bye-law.

Not giving Notice of Change of Place of Abode.

33. No person licensed under this bye-law shall change his place of abode and neglect for two days to give notice of such change to the council of the borough, and to produce his license in order that a memorandum of such change may be endorsed

Smoking.

34. No person shall persist in smoking tobacco or opium in any hackney carriage after being warned by the driver or any passenger to desist.

Parting with a License.

35. No person to whom a license shall have been granted shall transfer except in compliance with this bye-law, or lend such license to any other person.

Plying for hire with Carriage, &c., unfit for use.

36. No person shall ply for hire with any hackney carriage, horse, or harness, which shall be at the time unfit for public

Acting as a Driver without a License.

37. No person shall act as a driver of any hackney carriage whether such person shall or shall not be the proprietor thereof, without in each case having a driver's license in force as required

by this bye-law.

38. No proprietor of a hackney carriage who shall act as driver thereof shall refuse or neglect to produce to any person who may wish to inspect it, his driver's license.

Not complying with Directions for production of Licensed Carriage.

39. No person shall refuse or neglect to produce any licensed carriage, horses, or harness, before any person to be duly appointed for that purpose, at the time and place directed.

Proprietors permitting Unlicensed Persons to drive.

40. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall knowingly suffer any person not duly licensed under the authority of this byelaw to act as driver of any hackney carriage of which he shall be the proprietor or part proprietor.

Not keeping Painted on Carriage particulars.

41. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall omit to keep distinctly painted on the same in the manner required by this bye-law, the particulars herein required to be so painted thereon.

Withdrawing Carriage from hire.

42. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall withdraw his carriage from hire for two consecutive days, or for any two days in one week, without just cause, unless with the conrent of the council.

Not placing Lamps on Carriages.

43. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall omit to place upon the same proper lamps, as in manner herein required.

Proprietor not obtaining Possession of Driver's License.

44. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall neglect to require to be delivered to him, or to retain in his possession the license of any driver during such period as such driver shall remain in his service, or shall neglect or refuse to produce such license before any justice of the peace when called upon, if such driver shall be in his service at the time of being so called upon, or shall not upon demand deliver to any driver, when leaving his service, such driver's license.

Plying on Streets.

45. No driver of a hackney carriage shall ply for hire in any street, except at some stand appointed by this bye-law; or by loitering or any wilful misbehaviour shall cause any obstruction

in or upon any street or thoroughfare, and shall not when driving over any crossing proceed at a greater pace than atithe rate of four miles within the hour.

Demanding more than Legal Fare.

46. No driver of a hackney carriage shall demand more than the legal fare for any passenger.

Carrying more Passengers than allowed.
47. No driver of a hackney carriage shall carry in any such carriage a greater number of passengers than allowed by law.

Driver Smoking.

48. No driver of a hackney carriage shall, against the will of any passenger, smoke tobacco or opium whilst acting in such capacity.

Driver stopping Carriage at Crossing.

49. No driver of a hackney carriage, for the purpose of taking up or setting down a passenger (except in case of accident or other unavoidable necessity), shall stop such carriage opposite to the end of any street, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage way.

Not carrying full complement of Passengers.

50. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to admit or carry in his hackney carriage the number of persons painted on such carriage.

Not keeping Lamps lighted between Sunset and Sunrise.
51. No driver of a hackney carriage, when the same is in use between sunset and sunrise, shall omit to keep the lamps of the same properly lighted.

Drunkenness and Insulting Behaviour of Drivers.
52. No driver of a hackney carriage shall during his employment be drunk, or make use of any insulting or abusive language, or be guilty of any insulting gesture or any misbehaviour.

Not carrying reasonable quantity of Luggage.

53. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to carry by his carriage a reasonable quantity of luggage for any person hiring or intending to hire the same.

Refusing Hire.

54. No driver, after tender or payment of his proper fare, shall refuse to drive any backney carriage to any place within the borough to which he shall be required to drive any person hiring or intending to hire such carriage, or between six o clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening shall refuse to drive any such carriage for any time not exceeding one hour, if so required by any person hiring or intending to hire such carriage.

Omitting to deliver Ticket.

55. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse or neglect to deliver to the hirer of his hackney carriage a card with his name and the number of his license, and a statement of the fares he is authorised to charge printed thereon.

Taking Number or giving Wrong Number.

56. No driver of a hackney carriage shall prevent any person from taking and noting the number of the same, or of the driver thereof, or shall by word of mouth give or declare to any person a wrong number as or for the number of such carriage or of the driver thereof.

Permitting persons to ride.

57. No driver of a hackney carriage shall permit or suffer any person to ride or be carried in upon, or about such hackney carriage without the consent of the person hiring the same.

Feeding Horses.

58. No driver of a hackney carriage shall feed the horse or horses of or belonging to any hackney carriage in any street, road, or common passage, save only with corn or chaff out of a nose-bag, and shall not remove such horses' winkers during the nose-bag, and sh time of feeding.

Obstructing other Carriages, &c.

59. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to give way, if
he conveniently can, to any private carriage or vehicle, or shall
obstruct or hinder the driver of any other hackney carriage in
taking up or setting down any person into or from such other
hackney carriage. hackney carriage.

Driver leaving Carriage unattended.
60. No driver of a hackney carriage shall leave the same unattended in any street, road, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, whether such carriage shall be hired or not.

Carrying Persons Drunk, Coffins, Dead Bodies, &c.
61. No driver of any hackney carriage shall, against the will of any passenger, carry or permit to be carried in or upon such carriage any person in a state of intoxication, or any coffin or dead body.

Hackney carriages plying for hire between the borough of Sebastopol and the suburbs of such borough, and charging each passenger carried a fixed rate, shall charge each such passenger three pence for each mile or fractional part of a mile.

But if any place usually recognised as a stopping-place for carriages so plying for hire be not more than half a mile beyond the number of miles completed, any passenger shall not be charged for being carried to or not beyond such stopping-place mire than the fare for the number of miles actually completed. Botween the hours of Eight o'clock in the evening and Midnight an increased fare of one penny per mile, and between the hours of Midnight and Six o'clock in the morning a fare of sixpence per mile.
