## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the seventh day of December in the present year, the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions shall have jurisdiction were defined: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace having jurisdiction within the places or districts defined as hereinbefore mentioned shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

## REGULATIONS FOR OFFICIAL AGENTS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Official Agents, viz.:-

1. Every official shall in respect of each company in his hands keep a separate account at a bank, to be approved of by the Government, in his name as "Official Agent of the [stating name of the] Company." To such account all moneys received by him, belonging to such company, shall be paid forthwith, and in every case within forty-eight hours of receipt; and no such moneys shall be withdrawn from such account, except to meet claims approved and ordered to be paid by the Court of Mines.

2. Every payment in respect of any company shall be made by cheque on the bank account of that company, and must be supported by a receipt setting forth the service or claim in respect of which the payment is made.

3. No bill of costs for law expenses incurred by the official agent in connection with any company shall be paid from the funds of the company, unless such bill be first submitted to and allowed by the Court of Mines.

4. As soon as practicable after any company is placed in the hands of the official agent for winding up, he shall enter in a book to be kept for the purpose, an inventory of the property and credits of the company, and a list of the persons liable to contribute to the assets thereof, and the amount of their liability respectively, and shall, from time to time, as contributions are paid, note against the names of such persons the amounts paid by each respectively, with the date of payment; and shall also enter in the same book every liability of the company when ascertained; and such book shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by all persons interested, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence.

5. The official agent shall not in any case apply for warrants to call in a greater amount of capital than is reasonably necessary to meet the liabilities of the company and the expenses connected with the winding-up thereof.

6. The official agent shall on the first day of each month, having first paid into the proper bank accounts all moneys received in respect of any company, despatch to the Minister of Justice a return of the transactions during the preceding month in the Form annexed.

7. Such return shall contain all the particulars indicated by the form, and bear a certificate signed by the manager or officer in charge of the bank, that the balances shown on the return are in the bank to the credit of the several companies.

8. The accounts of the official agent will be inspected from time to time by an official auditor, and the official agent shall at all times on the demand of such auditor, deliver to him for the purposes of audit, all accounts, books, papers, and documents connected with the office of such agent or any company in his hands, and shall afford every reasonable facility for such audit.

9. A special audit will be held on the application of any creditor or shareholder of a company placed in the hands of an official agent, upon the expense of such audit being guaranteed to the satisfaction of the Minister of Justice.

10. No official agent shall receive any profit, or any payment direct or indirect, for services in any way connected with his official duties, or with any company in his hands, except for the commission of 5 per cent. allowed to him by law.

11. Under special circumstances the Minister of Justice may authorize a departure from these regulations.

12. Any official agent violating or neglecting to comply with these regulations will be liable to dismissal.

13. The regulations shall take effect on and after the 1st January, 1869.

3. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued.
