WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas, by The Amendam Land, Act 1865 it is amongst other things' enacted; that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or proclaim (as the case may be) certain commons as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—
