THE Governor in Council directs it to be notified that no vessel arriving at any port on the north coast of Tasmania west of the Tamar, having on board infectious disease, will be allowed to anchor or communicate with the shore, but will be required to proceed forthwith to the authorized Quarantine Ground in the River Tamar, and there await the instructions of the Health Officer.

I transmit to you herewith a copy of a letter from the Foreign Office (16th October, 1867), with a Circular Order (27th September, 1807), which has been issued by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to Her Majesty's ships of the naval establishments at home and abroad, desiring them to recognise the new flags which have been established by His Majesty the King of Prussia, for ships of war and merchant vessels of the North German Confederation.

I have to instruct you that these flags are to be recognised accordingly in the colony under your government, and to receive the same consideration and immunities that have hitherto been enjoyed by the flags of Prussia and the Federal States.

(Prusian Flags.)

The King of Prussia having established the flags below for ships of war and merchant vessels of the "North German Confederation," it is their Lordships' directions that these flags be recognised as such by H.M. ships, and that they receive in every way the same consideration and immunities that have hitherto been enjoyed by the flags of Prussia and the Federal States.

MAN OF WAR.—White field divided into four compartments by black cross pierced in the centre with Imperial Eagle. The upper left hand compartment black, white, and red, horizontally, with cross patee in centre in black.

MERCHANT VESSEL.-Black, white, and red, horizontally.
