The clothing of the child consisted of a new flannel night-gown, a flannel roller, a calico night-dress, and a coarse twilled napkin; the first of the above-mentioned articles being fastened with runner strings, and the others with pins.

The body seemed to have been about ten days in the water, and may possibly have been carried by the current of the river to the spot where it was found.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1854, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the license to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the eyening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne, or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Belfast has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the provise of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Belfast to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.
