#### ATTEMPT TO BURN PREMISES AT NEWTOWN, GEELONG.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

HEREAS about half an hour after midnight on Wednesday, the lst of January last, an attempt was made to destroy by fire the house of Saunders Trotman, at Newtown, Geelong, a bundle of greasy rags having been set on fire under each of the two verandahs of the house: And whereas at an inquest held to investigate the circumstances the jury returned a verdict amounting to a charge of malicious incendiarism against some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of the attempt to burn the said premises. The Governor will also, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, grant a Free Pardon to any person implicated in the attempt above described (not being the person or persons who actually set fire to the combustibles) who will give the required information.
