TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about half-past Two o'clock in the morning of Friday, the 31st January last, a Fire occurred at Lower Three-mile Creek, near Beechworth, by which a Stack containing about six tons of straw and a Hut containing about two tons of hay, the property of Joseph Stephens, were totally destroyed: And whereas at an inquest the jury returned a verdict that the fire was wilfully caused: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons who caused the fire whereby the above-mentioned property was destroyed.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common,

or a gold-fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

DUNNEWORTHY TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Dunneworthy Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 30th day of July, 1866, and altered in accordance with a Proclamation dated the 26th day of November, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotments 49 and 93, in the parish of Dunneworthy, containing an area of 1221 acres and 37 perches.—(67.O.15459.)

The rate of mortality which prevailed in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January, was very low for the season of the year; the month was cooler than usual, the mean temperature in the shade being 2½ degrees below the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females. Sixty-two per cent. were of children under five years of age, against 75 per cent. in January, 1867; 65½ per cent. in January, 1866; 65 per cent. in January, 1865; 64 per cent. in January, 1864; 64 per cent. in January, 1863; 63 per cent. in January, 1862; 71 per cent. in January, 1861; and 73 per cent. in January, 1860. It will be observed that in no previous month of January has the proportion of deaths of young children to the whole mortality been so low as in the month under review.

Twenty deaths occurred on the 20th, 18 on the 11th, and 16 on the 15th of the month. These were the days of highest mortality. Those of the lowest were the 9th, on which only three deaths were recorded, and the 23rd, 26th, and 28th, on each of which no more than seven deaths were recorded.

Six persons of 75 years of age or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of paralysis, a female aged 75 of bronchitis, a female aged 77 of dropsy, a male aged 81 of cancer, a male aged 82 of heart disease, and a female aged 85 of old age.

Ten violent deaths occurred during the month, all of which are attributed to accident. Their particulars are as follow:—An infant 9 weeks old died of a fractured skull, how the accident was occasioned is not stated, but the verdict was accidental death; a girl 4 years of age was killed by the fall of a gate, a boy aged 8 died of injuries received by being thrown from a cart, a jockey aged 19 died from the effects of a fall from a horse, a woollorter aged 25 died of tetanus resulting from a cut in the finger, an infant aged 15 weeks died of a scald, a male child aged 15 months was drowned at Brighton, another aged 5 years was found drowned at St. Kilda, and another aged 8 years was drowned in the Yarra, a cabinetmaker aged 54 was accidentally choked when drunk.

Sixty-one deaths, or about 17 per cent. of the whole mortality, occurred in Public Institutions, viz., 23 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Industrial Schools, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Military Barracks, and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.13 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 217, of which 108, or nearly 50 per cent., were of males, and 109, or about 50 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 151 were under one year of age, 50 were between one and two years, 9 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 134, of which 81, or about 60 per cent., were males, and 53, or nearly 40 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 10 were between forty-five and fifty, 8 were between fifty and fifty-five, 3 were between fifty-five and sixty, 3 were between sixty and sixty-five, 8 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

As may be expected at this season of the year, the most fatal class of diseases was the zymotic, which caused about 35 per cent. of the mortality both in December and January. The principal diseases under this head show a slight diminution in the latter month as compared with the former. Thus scarlatina and diphtheria caused 12 deaths in January against 16 in December, whooping-cough caused 25 deaths against 29, and dysentery and diarrhoea caused 53 deaths against 55. The proportion of deaths from constitutional diseases to the whole mortality was something under 15 per cent. both in December and January. Under this head phthisis caused 32 deaths in the former month, and 29 in the latter.

Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12.
