PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO A PORTION OF THE BOROUGH OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON, AND THE VICINITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Public Health Amending Statute 1867* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twelfth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Act 18 Victoria, No. 13, intitled *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous Places in the Colony of Victoria*, was extended to the district therein described, and designated "The District of Flemington (including Essendon, Hawstead, and Kensington):" And whereas it is expedient to alter the said district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the said *Public Health Amending Statute 1867* shall apply to the portion of the Borough of Essendon and Flemington and lands adjacent included in the subjoined description, that is to say: Commencing at the south-west angle of the borough of Hotham; thence by the west boundary of that borough, bearing north to the north-eastern side of the road from Melbourne to Essendon; thence by the said side of that road bearing north-westerly to the Moonee Ponds; thence by the Moonee Ponds bearing south-westerly to the south boundary of allotment 15 of section 5, in the parish of Doughty Galla; thence by the said boundary of that allotment bearing west to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line (crossing a road) bearing west to the north-eastern side of the Macaulay road; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to Raleigh's Point road; thence by that road bearing west to the Saltwater River; thence by that river and the north-eastern boundary of the borough of Footscray, bearing south-easterly to the north-east angle of the town of Footscray; and thence by a line bearing easterly to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

Twelve out of the twenty deaths registered in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. The mortality in North Melbourne has been unusually heavy; scarlatina, diarrhoea, croup, and diphtheria being especially fatal. The prevalence of bowel affections is noted in most of the districts, and the consequence, both in the metropolis and suburbs, of the recent intense heat is significantly shown in the heavy total of ninety-three as the mortality for the week.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CRESWICK BOROUGH COMMON.

(Passed at a Special Meeting of the Borough Council, held on 6th March, 1868.)

THE Borough Common shall be held to include all that portion of land granted by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, No. 157, dated the 15th day of December, 1865.

2. All persons entitled to depasture cattle on the Creswick Borough Common shall be allowed to run four head of cattle in respect of their right as residents within the borough.

3. All persons depasturing cattle upon the common shall be required to take out a license, and pay fees for same at the rate of six shillings per head per annum for horned cattle, eight shillings per head for horses, two shillings and sixpence per head for sheep, and one shilling per head for goats; payable half-yearly in advance; half-yearly days to be on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

4. The managers shall have power to grant special licenses to slaughtermen, butchers, and dairymen, as authorized by *The Land Act 1862*, for depasturing any larger number of stock: horned cattle at five shillings per head per annum in such

numbers as the managers may determine, and sheep and pigs at one shilling and sixpence per head per annum.

5. All persons taking cattle to the common shall be required to deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, together with a duplicate of the written statement of the number, description, and brand of the cattle so delivered; they must also produce their depasturing license, which the herdsman will countersign to prevent any transfer or imposition. The herdsman will give a receipt for the cattle delivered to him and enter a copy of it in the herd-book, and shall afterwards proceed to brand the cattle with the common brand, in pitch or paint; the owners, in all cases, to render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding: provided that it shall be optional with the owners of horses whether they have them branded with the common brand or not.

6. All cattle returning home from the common must be brought back by the owner and re-delivered to the herdsman, but should the herdsman see any cattle straying from the common he shall be required to bring them back; and in no case shall the herdsman be held responsible for the absolute loss of cattle.

7. Cattle under six months of age, the progeny of cattle depasturing under license upon the common, to be free; but no bulls, rigs, or entires, over the age of nine months, shall be depastured upon the common, without the written consent of the managers.

8. The herdsman shall be required to see that travelling herds and flocks of sheep shall be kept strictly within the limits of the boundaries in passing over the common, as provided in the 78th section of *The Land Act 1862*.

9. The managers may from time to time, when considered necessary, call upon the owners of stock, by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district, to come forward to re-brand their cattle; and if such order be disregarded for a period of two days, the herdsman shall re-brand such cattle at the expense of the owners thereof; provided that the cost of such re-branding shall not exceed one shilling per head.

10. Substitution licenses will be granted in lieu of those cattle permanently removed from the common, but only in cases in which the owner shall give notice to the herdsman of such removal, and sign the herdsman's delivery-book.

11. The managers may at any time require persons putting cattle on the common to make a declaration, certifying the *bona fide* ownership of such cattle; also that they are entitled, from their proximity to the common, to depasture stock.

12. All cattle depastured on the common shall be branded with some distinct brand of the owners, in addition to any station brand that may be thereon.

13. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge shall be made upon each commoner, in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured; and each license granted will be made a condition that he can be sued for the same, and the amount recovered before any justice of the peace.

14. All diseased cattle, or cattle suspected of being diseased, shall be removed off the common by the owners of such cattle, after twelve hours' written notice from the managers ordering such removal, delivered by the herdsman at the owner's usual place of residence; and should such order be disregarded, or the owners neglect to remove such cattle, they shall be considered trespassers, and be liable to the penalty inflicted under the 129th section of *The Land Act 1862*. And no such cattle so removed off the common shall be again depastured thereon without the written consent of the managers having been previously obtained.

15. No sheep shall be depastured on any part of the common, except they are the *bona fide* property of butchers or slaughtermen residing within the borough; and no such butcher or slaughterman shall be allowed to depasture more than one hundred sheep on the common at any one time.

BYE-LAWS.

1. An election of three managers of the common shall take place at the first meeting of the Borough Council in the month of February in every year.

2. The managers may elect a chairman, who shall be considered treasurer, and may appoint a secretary and herdsman. A meeting of the managers shall be held in the Council Chambers on the first Thursday in each month, between the hours of seven and nine o'clock p.m., for the purpose of comparing the secretary's and herdsman's books, to hear complaints, if any, and for the transaction of other business.

3. The secretary shall, on a day to be hereafter named, attend at to register the cattle and receive the fees from all persons entitled to depasture cattle on the said common. Any person failing to pay the fees within one week after they are due, will be liable to have his cattle impounded.

4. All moneys received to be placed in the bank to the credit of the managers; all payments to be made by cheque, signed by not less than two of the managers; all accounts to be passed at a meeting of the managers before payment of same.

5. The managers to pay the herdsman from the fees derivable from the common, and other sources connected with the same; the residue (if any) to be applied in making waterholes, the eradication of thistles, or for any other local purpose the managers may think for the benefit of the borough, subject to the approval of the Borough Council.

HERDSMAN.

1. The herdsman must reside on the common, devote the whole of his time to the duties connected therewith, attend at such places and times as may be directed by the managers, to receive and brand cattle, keep a register of such cattle, give a receipt for same, exercise due vigilance, muster the cattle when required by the managers for that purpose, and impound stray cattle under the directions of the managers.

2. The herdsman shall be allowed to run four head of cattle and four horses without charge.

3. The fees derivable from impounding cattle from the common, to be added to the general fund thereof; and the herdsman shall be required to bring forward at each meeting of the managers, the number of such impoundings (if any), and the amount of revenue derived therefrom.

4. The common brand to be registered in all the surrounding pounds, viz.:—Ballarat, Creswick, Smeaton, Clunes, Carisbrook, Lexton, Amherst, and Daylesford, and the herdsman shall give notice to the owners of stock (entitled to pasturage) that may get impounded in any such pounds, within twenty-four hours after receiving notice from the poundkeepers, and the cost of releasing cattle from the pound shall in all cases be paid by the owner thereof.

5. Any complaints against the herdsman of negligence, misconduct, or connivance to put cattle on the common without payment of fees for same, must be in writing; and should the managers, after investigation, consider that sufficient evidence has been produced to substantiate such charge, they shall have the power to dismiss such offender summarily.

6. The herdsman shall produce all books and accounts in connection with the common once a month, or oftener if required, at the office of the managers, to be examined; and to conform to such other regulations as the Borough Council may from time to time consider necessary for the proper working of the common.

7. The Borough Council reserves for itself the power to alter, amend, or abolish any of the foregoing rules or bye-laws, or frame new ones whenever it may consider it necessary to do so.
