LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

BALLARAT EAST ELECTION—PETITION.

I HEREBY notify that there was presented to me, on Monday, the twenty-third day of March instant, a petition, of which the following is a true copy.

To the Honorable Sir Francis Murphy, Knight, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria.

The Petition of Charles Edwin Jones, of Fitz Roy, in the said colony, writer.

Respectfully sheweth—

First.—That on the sixth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, a writ was duly issued by the Governor, directed to Archibald Fiskin, Esquire, the returning officer for the electoral district of Ballarat East, requiring him to proceed to the election of two members to serve for the said district in the Legislative Assembly.

Second.—That in accordance with the exigency of such writ the said returning officer proceeded to the said election, and your petitioner was duly nominated as one such member, together with Charles Dyte, James Eddy, and John Basson Humfray, and in consequence of the number of persons thus duly nominated as candidates exceeding the number of members to be elected a poll was appointed to be taken by the said returning officer, on the twentieth day of February aforesaid, and that such poll was accordingly taken on the said twentieth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, being the day named in the said writ for the taking of the poll in the said election.

Third.—That such poll was taken at divers polling-places and polling-booths, and among others at the Town-Hall, Ballarat East, for certain portions of the roll of Ballarat East Proper division of the said electoral district; at the Common School-room, Mount Clear, for the South road division of the said district; and at the Common School-room, near the Border Saw-mills, the Common School-room, Melbourne road, and the Board-room, Melbourne road, for the Warrenheip division of the said electoral district of Ballarat East.

Fourth.—That on the twenty-first day of the said month of February the said returning officer officially declared the general state of the poll as the same had been made up by him, and then declared that One thousand and forty-two votes had been polled in favor of the said Charles Dyte, Eight hundred and thirty-six votes in favor of the said John Basson Humfray, Eight hundred and twenty-six votes in favor of your petitioner, and Seven hundred and seventy-seven votes in favor of the said James Eddy, and then declared that the said Charles Dyte and John Basson Humfray had been duly elected members of the Legislative Assembly for the said electoral district of Ballarat East, and the said returning officer accordingly endorsed their names on the said writ, and returned the same so endorsed to the Governor.

Fifth.—That the said John Basson Humfray had, according to the declaration of the poll so made by the said returning officer, a majority of ten votes over your petitioner, but that notwithstanding such declaration your petitioner submits that the said John Basson Humfray was not, and that your petitioner was, the second duly elected member for the electoral district of Ballarat East in the said election, but for illegal votes having been unduly taken into account; and your petitioner therefore complains that the said election was not duly taken, and that the said return was unduly made, as certain facts hereinafter to be set forth will make clear so far as regards the election and return of the said John Basson Humfray.

Sixth.—Your petitioner complains that a large number of persons, alien born, and not naturalized nor denizen subjects of Her Majesty, as required by *The Electoral Act 1865*, and not legally entitled to vote in an election of members to serve in Parliament in this colony, took part in the said election of members for the said electoral district of Ballarat East, and voted therein, contrary to the provisions of the said Act, by means of electors' rights improperly obtained, and by means of their names being improperly allowed to appear in and upon the ratepayers' roll of electors and the general rolls in force at the time of the said polling for the electoral district of Ballarat East, and that such persons did thus illegally record their votes or pretended votes in the said election in favor of the said John Basson Humfray, in spite of objections made thereto by scrutineers appointed by your petitioner in terms of the Act aforesaid.

Seventh.—Your petitioner submits that *The Electoral Act 1865* provides that only persons who are natural born subjects of Her Majesty, or naturalized, or denizen subjects who have been so naturalized or denizen for a period not less than three years, and who have resided in this colony during twelve months next preceding an election, can be entitled to vote in such election of members of Parliament by means of electors' rights, or by virtue of their names appearing in the ratepayers' roll of electors in any division of any electoral district; and therefore that it is not legal nor proper that any votes or pretended votes which may appear to have been recorded by such aliens aforesaid, contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, should be taken into account in estimating the numbers polled for the several candidates in the said election for Ballarat East, as such votes have been so improperly taken into account in the said election.

Eighth.—Your petitioner complains that the roll of ratepaying electors in force in the Warrenheip division of the electoral district aforesaid at the time of the said election, was falsified by the insertion of a large number of names, amounting in all to more than one hundred and fifty such names, of persons not residing in the said division nor paying rates therein, nor liable to be rated in the said division of the said district, and not entitled to vote as ratepayers in respect of rateable property

situated within such division of such electoral district, and whose names had not appeared and do not now appear in any certified roll of persons entitled to vote as ratepayers in the said division of the said district, and whose names were thus improperly and wrongfully placed in and upon the said roll of ratepaying electors for the Warrenheip division of the electoral district of Ballarat East, and who were thus, contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, enabled to vote in the said election; and your petitioner alleges and believes that a large number of such votes, about seventy in all, were by such means wrongfully polled by persons wrongfully included in the roll aforesaid or by other persons voting in their names, as if they had been ratepayers duly entitled to vote, in favor of the said John Basson Humfray in the said election.

Ninth.—Your petitioner complains that persons duly entitled to vote in the said election as ratepayers within the Warrenheip division of the said electoral district, exceeding seventy in number, whose names had appeared, and do now appear, in the certified roll of ratepayers in force within the road board district of Bungaree, from which the roll of ratepaying electors should have been, and was ostensibly compiled for the said Warrenheip division, were wrongfully omitted from the roll of ratepaying electors for the division aforesaid, and were thus deprived of the power to vote in the said election to which they otherwise were legally entitled, but for the act of culpable negligence or fraud by which their names were omitted from the said roll, contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*; and your petitioner believes that a very large number of the persons whose names were thus wrongfully omitted from the said roll were desirous to vote for him, and would, if the proper facilities had been afforded to them according to the provisions of the Act before mentioned, have polled their said votes in his favor in the said election.

Tenth.—That at the said election for the said electoral district divers persons did fraudulently vote by means of substitute rights obtained during the time the poll for the said election was being taken or otherwise within the period of seven days before the day of the said poll being taken, contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and your petitioner believes that such votes thus wrongfully tendered and received were polled at the said election in favor of the said John Basson Humfray.

Eleventh.—That at the said election divers persons did fraudulently vote more than once in different divisions of the said district, and taking advantage of their names appearing more than once on the rolls of ratepaying electors in the several divisions of the said district, and of their names also appearing on the general roll as holders of electors' rights.

Twelfth.—That at and during the said election several persons, reputed to be interested in the success of the said John Basson Humfray, held and distributed, for fraudulent purposes, a large number of electors' rights to divers other persons, who were not entitled to use such rights in the said election; and that at and during the said election divers persons did fraudulently personate other persons, whose names were upon the general roll for the said district, by means of such rights fraudulently obtained; and did also fraudulently personate other persons whose names appeared on the roll of ratepaying electors for the said district; and the votes of the said persons so personating were received by the returning officer and deputy returning officers at such election, under the supposition that such persons were the electors whom they thus fraudulently personated as aforesaid; and your petitioner has reason to believe that a large number of votes or pretended votes were thus fraudulently polled in favor of the said John Basson Humfray.

Thirteenth.—That many of the said electors, who had been so personated, afterwards came to the respective polling-places or polling-booths to vote at the said election; and divers of such electors, upon being informed that persons had voted in their names pretending to be such electors, departed without voting; and divers other of the said electors, who had been so personated as aforesaid, tendered their ballot-papers as provided by *The Electoral Act 1865*, but that such votes were not allowed, and divers of such ballot-papers were not put into the ballot-boxes, but were sealed up in a separate parcel as provided by the aforesaid Act; and your petitioner believes that a large number of such voters desired to vote and did tender their said votes in his favor.

Fourteenth.—That many duly qualified electors who presented themselves to vote at their respective polling-places at the said election were prevented from voting for your petitioner by reason of their names having been misspelt, their said votes being for such reasons refused, although such electors stated, when tendering their said votes, that they were the persons whose names appeared misspelt on the said rolls, and were further prepared to answer any questions in elucidation of their claims to vote; while in other cases, in which similar clerical errors had been made in the compilation or printing of the said roll, the votes of other electors were received in the said polling-places at the said election.

Fifteenth.—That the whole of the votes actually taken at the polling-place known as "Number Two" polling-booth, in the Town Hall, Ballarat East, at the said election, have not been correctly reckoned, and that defaced voting-papers have been improperly reckoned and taken into account in the said booth; and that your petitioner has been informed by his scrutineer who officiated in the said polling-booth that, among other irregularities which occurred in the said booth, an alteration appears to have been made in the statement of the total number of votes polled for the said John Basson Humfray, whereby the number of votes polled for him was stated in excess of the number actually polled on his behalf at such election.

Sixteenth.—That a person named John P. Blair, who was officiating as poll clerk in the polling-place aforesaid, known as "Number Two polling-booth," during the said election, did contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, remove a voting-paper from the said booth; and your petitioner has been informed, and believes, that the said voting-paper was re-

moved from the said polling-booth in order to influence a voter or voters in favor of the said John Basson Humfray, towards whom it was matter of common report and free admission that the said poll clerk was very favorably disposed.

Seventeenth.—That a person presented himself in the polling-place afore-mentioned known as "Number Two polling-booth," and set apart in the said election for polling the votes of electors whose surnames commenced with one of the letters of the alphabet from the letter D to the letter G, both inclusive, and desired to vote in the name of Isaac Davies; but, in consequence of the scrutineer appointed by your petitioner to act in the said booth knowing the person who tendered the said vote he departed thence without voting, and the said vote was afterwards tendered and received in another polling-booth, as shortly afterwards the returning officer, Archibald Fiskin, Esquire, who himself officiated in the polling-place known as "Number One polling-booth," in the said Town Hall, where only persons whose surnames commenced with one of the letters of the alphabet from the letter A to the letter C, both inclusive, were to be permitted to vote, entered the polling-booth Number Two aforesaid, and informed the deputy returning officer therein officiating that he had allowed a person answering to the name of Isaac Davies to vote out of the usual course in Number One polling-booth, the same being contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*; and your petitioner has been informed, and believes, that the said vote, beside being unduly tendered and received at the wrong polling-place or booth, was tendered by means of personation, and for both of the reasons herein set forth should not be reckoned among the votes at the said election.

Eighteenth.—That the deputy returning officer for the South-road division of the said electoral district at the said election did allow a second balloting-paper to an elector named George Carnegie, after the first voting-paper supplied to the said George Carnegie had been defaced by him, and that this was done avowedly to allow the said George Carnegie to vote in favor of the said John Basson Humfray; and that defaced voting-papers were, in the said polling-place or booth and in the several polling-places or booths appointed for the several divisions of the said electoral district, in many instances taken and reckoned to increase the number of votes apparently polled in favor of the said John Basson Humfray at the said election.

Nineteenth.—That it having become known that a large number of electors' rights had been improperly distributed in the Warrenheip division of the said district, on and before the day of polling at the said election, in order to the subornation of personation by means of such rights, the scrutineer appointed by your petitioner to act in the Common School-room polling-place, at the Leigh Creek Melbourne road, in the Warrenheip division of the said district, at the said election, requested the deputy returning officer officiating in the said polling-place to cause certain persons not known as residents in the district, who presented themselves to vote by means of electors' rights, to sign their names in a book provided for that purpose, in accordance with the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and that the said deputy returning officer refused to comply with such requirement, contrary to the provisions of the said Act, and in consequence of such refusal to carry out the law, your petitioner has been informed, and believes, that many votes were polled by personators in the said polling-booth, which almost adjoins the premises of the person who was mainly instrumental in distributing electors' rights for fraudulent purposes in the said election.

Twentieth.—That your petitioner alleges that if all the votes improperly and fraudulently polled by means of aliens voting, and by means of names improperly inserted in the rolls of rate-paying electors, and by means of double voting, personation, and the improper use of substitute rights, and by such other fraudulent and improper means as have been hereinbefore set forth, were to be struck off, it would appear that your petitioner obtained a larger number of votes at the said election than the said John Basson Humfray.

Your petitioner therefore humbly prays—

Twenty-first.—That you will as soon as conveniently may be lay this his petition before the Legislative Assembly, and that the same may be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.

Twenty-second.—And that such committee may take the premises into their consideration.

Twenty-third.—And that all the votes polled at the said election by persons alien by birth and not made denizen nor naturalized subjects of Her Majesty during a term of years, in accordance with the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, may be struck off.

Twenty-fourth.—And that all the votes polled at the said election by persons whose names can be shown to have been wrongfully inserted in the roll of rate-paying electors for the Warrenheip division of the said electoral district, without warrant or adequate authority, contrary to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, may be struck off.

Twenty-fifth.—And that all the votes polled during the said election contrary to the provisions of the said Act, by means of substitute rights which had been obtained on the day of the said polling, or at other periods less than seven clear days previous to the said day of polling, may be struck off.

Twenty-sixth.—And that all the votes, save the first vote, of every person who voted more than once, or in whose name more than one vote has been polled in the said election, although it may not be practicable to show by whom such subsequent and false votes have been polled, may be struck off.

Twenty-seventh.—And that all the voting-papers placed in the several ballot-boxes by all persons who personated electors, or who personated other persons whose names appeared on the general roll, or on the rate-paying roll of electors for the

said electoral district, may be rejected, and that the votes or pretended votes given by such persons in the names of such electors, or other persons whose names appeared on such general rolls or rate-paying rolls of electors, may be struck off from the return of votes given at the said election.

Twenty-eighth.—And that those electors who departed from the said polling-places or polling-booths without voting, in consequence of their being informed that persons had voted in their names, may be allowed to tender their said votes before the said committee, and that any and all such votes so tendered may be received by the said committee, and be by them reckoned and added to the votes already taken at the said election.

Twenty-ninth.—And that all the ballot-papers tendered, as hereinbefore set forth, by electors who had been personated in the said election and not allowed by the said returning officer and deputy returning officers, whether sealed up in separate parcels or placed in any of such ballot-boxes, may be received by the said committee, and the votes thereupon legally tendered be by them reckoned and added to the votes already taken at the said election.

Thirtieth.—And that all the votes which were tendered in the several polling-places or polling-booths aforesaid at the said election, and which were refused or disallowed by the said returning officer and deputy returning officers, by reason of the names of the said electors having been misspelt in the compilation of the said several rolls, or in the printing thereof, may be allowed to be tendered before the said committee, and that any and all such votes so tendered may be received by the said committee and added to the votes already taken at the said election.

Thirty-first.—And that there may be a scrutiny into the votes taken in the several polling-booths at the said election, for the verification of the several statements concerning the said election hereinbefore set forth; and more particularly that there may be a scrutiny into the votes taken at the polling-places known as Number One and Number Two polling-booths, in the Town Hall, Ballarat East, as aforesaid, and set apart for the letters of the alphabet A to C and D to G respectively; and that the votes therein taken may be counted afresh and accurately allotted to the several candidates for whom they shall appear to have been legally tendered; and that all defaced voting-papers shall be disallowed by the said committee; and that any and all votes which may appear on said scrutiny to have been polled by or for any elector in any polling-booth other than that polling-place or polling-booth in which, according to the provisions of *The Electoral Act 1865*, such votes should have been tendered and received, may be disallowed; and that all voting-papers which may be proven to have been marked for electors or others outside the said several polling-booths, whether such voting-papers may be proven to have been fraudulently printed or otherwise, may be, if the said papers have been used at the said election, disallowed by the said committee.

Thirty-second.—And that any vote and all votes which may be proven to the said committee to have been polled under undue influence at the said election, or by reason of a voting-paper or voting-papers having been removed from one or more of the said polling-booths, may be disallowed, and that there shall be a scrutiny of the several polling-papers used at the said election, to ascertain whether the said several voting-papers bare the signature or initials of the said returning officer, as required by *The Electoral Act 1865*.

Thirty-third.—And that any vote and all votes which shall appear to have been polled by any person or persons during the said election in any of the polling-places provided at the said election, by means of a second supply of voting-paper or papers to any person or persons after the first supply of such paper or papers had been by such person or persons defaced or otherwise used, may be disallowed and struck off from the numbers polled at the said election by the candidate for whom such votes may have been polled, by the said committee.

Thirty-fourth.—And that an enquiry may be prosecuted into the several irregularities and illegal acts hereinbefore complained of as having occurred or as having come to light at and during the said election; and that all the votes of all those persons, or any of them, who improperly voted at the said election, may be struck off; and that all the votes of all those persons, or any of them, who were by improper means, or by errors in the said several rolls, or in any of them, prevented from voting at the said election, may be allowed to be tendered before the said committee; and that the said votes so tendered may be by the said committee reckoned and added to the votes already polled at the said election.

Thirty-fifth.—And that after due enquiry such part or parts of the foregoing prayer of your petitioner as the said committee may consider him entitled to may be granted.

Thirty-sixth.—And that the said committee may determine on the matter of this petition, and report thereupon to the Legislative Assembly that the said John Basson Humfray was not duly elected a member of the Legislative Assembly for the said Electoral District of Ballarat East.

Thirty-seventh.—And that the said committee may further determine and report to the Legislative Assembly that your petitioner was at the said election duly elected a member of the Legislative Assembly for such district, and that the said return may be amended by inserting the name of your petitioner therein instead of the name of the said John Basson Humfray.

Thirty-eighth.—And that thereupon your petitioner may be sworn as a member of the Legislative Assembly, and may take his seat therein accordingly.

Thirty-ninth.—And that your petitioner may have such further and other relief as the nature of the case requires.

And your petitioner will ever pray, &c., &c.

BYE-LAW No. 41.—FOR REGULATING THE WARRNAMBOOL MARKET.

THE Market shall be open every Saturday from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, any commodity within the precincts of the said market before the hour for opening, or after the hour of closing the same.

2. *Stalls, shops, &c. to be cleaned.*—The holder of any shop, stall, shed, or other convenience, shall, within one hour after the opening of said market, and also previously to leaving the market, thoroughly cleanse his or her shop, stall, shed, or other convenience, and shall also clean the gutter and footway in front thereof.

3. *Where refuse is to be deposited.*—A space within the said market-site, to be called the "refuse depot," shall be set apart and enclosed for the receipt of all rubbish and refuse matter produced within the said market; and no person or persons occupying any shops, sheds, or stalls in the said market, shall deposit any rubbish or refuse matter in any other place than said refuse depot.

4. *Obstructions.*—No person or persons shall place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the said market, nor shall sweep, or cause to be swept, any dirt or rubbish into any of the gutters, streets, or foot-ways, nor drive any hook, nail, or peg in any wood, stone, or brickwork of any stalls, nor remove from such stall any hooks, pegs, or nails that may be inserted at the time of commencement of lease, without the sanction of the properly appointed officer of said borough council.

5. *Breach or neglect of bye-law.*—Any person who shall offend against this bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling.
